

Student Transitions – Graduation Dogwood 80 credits + 3 provincial assessments + Indigenous focused course Dual-Dogwood Recognizes the learner has met the French Immersion program requirements in addition to the Dogwood requirements Evergreen (*Policy 213: School Completion Certificate*) Celebrates the accomplishments of learners with diverse abilities or disabilities who have met the requirements of their individual education program and bridges to adult supports Adult Dogwood 20 credits + adult learners, 18 years and older

- Transition planning is a required part of all students' unique pathway:
 - Career Life Education (CLE) 10
 - Career Life Connections (CLC) 12
 - CLC 12, Capstone Project
 - Evergreen Transition Plan





Student Transitions – Promising Practices nvsd

- Student Voice
 - Continue to amplify and diversify the perspectives and feedback from the Student Inclusive Education Sub-Committee
- District Supports for Schools
 - Inclusive Education Work Experience Facilitator
 - District Careers Education Coordinator
 - School Psychologist flex time for high demand and specific supports

 - E.g. Transition Planning: Handbook for Students with Disabilities and Diverse Abilities in Grade 8 to 12


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
Student Transitions – Future


- Continue to develop targeted support structures for families


 Draw on partnership with the parent advisory councils (PACs) and community partners

- Ongoing review of 7/8 transition structures and systems













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





- Policy 605: Admission of Students to School:
