# 3. Argyle's Theatre



Students will receive an email to their SD44 email about the upcoming changes to provide them with step-by-step instructions on what to do on April 12<sup>th</sup>.

#### 8. Grade 12 Valedictorian Application – Due April 8th


Valedictorian applications are due Friday, April 8<sup>th</sup> by 9:30am. Further information and the application form can be found here:

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## 9. Ministry Graduation Assessments - Literacy 12 - April 25th to 29th

As part of the BC Graduation program, all current students must successfully complete the following Ministry of Education Graduation Assessments prior to the end of June in a student's final year of secondary school.

- Literacy 10
- Numeracy 10
- Literacy 12 (Scheduled for all Grade 12 students April 25, 26 and 27)

All current grade 12 students are scheduled to write their Literacy 12 assessment the week of April 25 – 29. Students are scheduled to write based on their English Studies 12 class and schedules are posted on the office windows for reference.

For those Grade 12 students who are not enrolled in an English Studies 12 section at Argyle this year they must confirm via email or MS Teams chat with Mr. Crowley their assessment date/time/location.

Grade 12 students who have not yet written their <u>Literacy 10</u> and/or <u>Numeracy 10</u> assessments are also expected to write these assessments in April. Mr. Crowley has contacted those students who have been scheduled for these assessments. If you have not received this confirmation, please see Mr. Crowley in person immediately.




#### 11. BC Youth Week - North Vancouver CityFest


