
3. Grad Fee Reminder

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4. NVSD Anti-Racism Committee Student Focus Group

The North Vancouver School District's Anti-Racism Committee is hosting a student focus group during the week of June 21st. The session will take place afterschool on Zoom from 3:15pm to 4:15pm. We would like to invite students who identify as a visible minority to participate in this virtual event. The discussion will be conducted by Bakau Consulting and will not include NVSD staff. Students who identify as a visible minority and who are available to participate after school are encouraged to sign up in the office with their name, grade, and email. These groups are being run to complement the equity, diversity and inclusion work that the North Vancouver School District has undertaken, along with our team at Bakau Consulting. In these one-hour long virtual sessions, we will be looking for a deeper understanding of what diversity and inclusion looks like for students, in relation to their interactions with the North Vancouver School District. The feedback we get will be incorporated with the quantitative data that has been collected through the surveys, already in circulation.

It's important that we hear from a wide range of voices that represent the whole community. All voices, opinions and experiences will be respected and valued for the contribution to our wider understanding. We're looking to hear back from as many students as possible, and will confirm spots in the group 48 hours beforehand while we try our best to have the groups be as diverse as possible.


Student privacy will be maintained. The sessions will be recorded over Zoom, in order to allow us to later review comments in preparation for our final report. All notes and comments shared within the report will be removed of all identifiable characteristics in order to maintain anonymity, and the recordings will be destroyed once the report has been prepared.
