1. Next Week

Monday & Tuesday - Review & Completion

2. Final Report Cards

Report cards will be published by end of day Wednesday, June 28th. You will receive an email when your student's report cards are available to view. Please ensure you download and save a copy of your child's report card prior to July 30th as report cards disappear at year-end rollover. This final report card will contain all courses and marks for the year. Your child also has access to their report card through their MyEd account. If there are any questions or concerns about your child's report card please contact teachers by email directly prior to June 30th.

3. <u>Yearbook Pick up Schedule</u>

Below are a few reminders about yearbook pickup:

- School Cash Online must be cleared and all resources returned prior to coming to collect a yearbook (if one was ordered).
- Students unable to pick up their yearbook at their scheduled time may either have a parent/guardian collect it, or they can have another Argyle student pick it up with a signed written note or a Teams message from their friend.
- We are unable to give yearbooks to students that are not Argyle students.
- Yearbooks can also be picked up on Wednesday, July 5th or in September if you are away Thursday.
- If you missed the opportunity to purchase a yearbook there may be some available for purchase starting at 9:00a.m. on Friday, June 30th from the office. They are \$50.00 **cash only**; first come first served until we run out of books. Please bring exact change. We are unable to order additional yearbook copies.
- Grade 12's will also be picking up graduation photos that were part of their graduation package at the same time as their yearbook pick up.

4. <u>Resource Return</u>

Textbooks and library books are now overdue. If your student has books outstanding, please return them to the Argyle Library book slot, <u>not</u> the classroom teacher. All textbooks and novels handed out are barcoded. The barcodes are scanned to sign in and out textbooks and library books, just like the local libraries.

If you have been assessed for items from past years, please return those directly to Mr. Peake in the office.

If you happen to find <u>any</u> other Argyle resources, uniforms, equipment, or books at your home please return them as next year's students need them.

5. <u>School Fees</u>

A final reminder to please ensure school fees are paid on <u>School Cash Online</u> prior to the end of the school year next week. Fees must be cleared prior to yearbook pick up.



6. 2023 Grad Ceremony

Argyle's 2023 graduation ceremony is on Sunday, June 25th at 11:00a.m. at the Orpheum Theatre. **Grads must arrive by 10:00a.m.** at the Granville Street entrance wearing their cap, vee-stole and gown. Doors for guests open at 10:00a.m. and the theatre seating opens at 10:30a.m. Guests enter through the Smythe Street entrance.

This is a ticketed event. All guests are required to have a ticket. Grads do not need a ticket; their ticket is wearing their cap, gown and vee-stole. Immediately after the ceremony grads will need to return their gown and vee-stole. Please ensure photos are taken prior to the ceremony. Grads keep their graduation caps.

D) Foundry's Art Workshop



I) SHAD Valley

Congratulations to grade 10 students Ella Waite, Jason Deng, and Keaton Johnson on being selected to attend Shad this summer.

Applications for this summer are closed, but this program opens for applications in September for Summer 2024. Interested students going into grades 10 or 11 are encouraged to browse the Shad website this summer.

Five students from the NVSD earned a place at Shad among 1,300 other highly motivated Grade 10 and 11 students to participate in a month-long STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, and Mathematics) and entrepreneurship program at one of <u>22 Canadian</u> <u>universities</u>. Shad has a <u>substantial financial assistance fund</u>.

Students are selected from *thousands* of applicants to participate in this amazing opportunity to prepare for post-secondary, participate in university level lectures and labs, hear from professional keynote speakers and connect with peers from across Canada.

J) Youth Advisory Council (YAC) for the Youth Development Instrument (YDI)

Are you passionate about improving youth well-being? Do you want to have your voice heard about issues affecting youth? If yes, please read on!

This winter all grade 11 students completed the <u>Youth Development Instrument</u> questionnaire, and all grade 8 students completed the Middle Years Development Instrument. The information from these questionnaires helps schools and communities learn about how youth are doing, including areas of strength and areas of growth. This year over 14,000 students took the YDI. The YDI was developed by a team of researchers from SFU, the Human Early Learning Partnership at UBC, and the BC Centre for Disease Control.



The <u>Youth Advisory Council</u> is a group of high school aged (15-18 years) youth who provide youth perspectives for the YDI project, including design of YDI survey and how results are shared with others and put into action. YAC members meet virtually with the YDI research team 5-6 times during the school year and are provided honorarium for their work.

YDI is looking specifically for youth representation from our region.
