

- Grades 11 & 12 50 to 99 hours of school service during the school year.
- Grades 9 & 10 25 to 49 hours of school service during the year.
- Grade 8 15+ hours of school service during the year.

Outstanding Service to Argyle School Awards (Major award)

- 100+ hours of school service to Argyle School (Grade 11, 12)
- 50+ hours of school service to Argyle School (Grades 8, 9, 10)

#### 4. June Graduation Assessments

The following students are scheduled to write a required BC Ministry of Education Graduation Assessment this June. Lists with the specific dates and times will be posted next week on bulletin boards and the front office windows. Students must check to see that their name is listed. Students who are not listed must see their counsellor promptly.

#### All Grade 10 students

• All current grade 10 students are scheduled to write their Numeracy 10 (NME10) assessment the week of June 19 – 23. Specific dates and times to be posted.

#### Select Grade 11 students

- Any current grade 11 students who have not completed the Numeracy 10 (NME10) assessment are scheduled to write this assessment on Monday, June 19<sup>th</sup> at 8:00am
- Students will be contacted by their counsellor, Ms. White via MS Teams chat

#### Select Grade 12 students

- Any grade 12 students missing either a Numeracy 10 (NME10), Literacy 10 (LTE10) or Literacy 12 (LTE12) assessment score will write their missing assessment on Monday, June 19<sup>th</sup> at 8:00am.
- Students will be contacted by their counsellor, Ms. Sigurdsson via MS Teams chat.
- Any French Immersion grade 12 students who have not written their French Literacy 12 (FTE12) assessment. This includes all semester 2 Français Langue 12 students and any semester 1 students who did not write in January.
- The oral component of the French exam will be scheduled during Flex the week of June 12
  16 and the written portion will be written on Wednesday, June 21<sup>st</sup> at 8:45am in the library.

Any current grade 10 or 11 students who have not yet written their Literacy 10 (LTE10) assessment will be scheduled to complete this assessment next November.
