COURSE OUTLINE

Welcome to Strings 8-12. Students are strongly recommended to have experience in choral performance to succeed in this course. The Argyle Chamber Choir is considered a 'flag-ship' ensemble within our community, and is often invited to participate in exciting events, trips, and learning opportunities. Students wishing to participate in this course must be willing to commit to a higher level of performance and provide a strong work ethic.

Students participating in this class will develop skills and conceptual knowledge in various aspects of choral music including but not limited to: vocal technique, vocal performance, sight-reading, music theory, diction, musicianship, vocal improvisation, professionalism, collaboration, and performance.

ATTENDANCE

Regular attendance is a significant factor in ensuring success in school. It is the responsibility of the parent(s)/legal guardian to ensure the student has regular school attendance. Occasionally, students must miss class for unavoidable reasons such as illness, family emergencies or medical/dental appointments.

- 1. A Parent or legal guardian must phone the school to inform them of a student's absence (Please be aware a teacher CANNOT excuse a student for an absence, and thus the office must be contacted in such event).
- 2. Students are also required to inform the teacher as soon as possible via MS TEAMS or verbally.

CONCERT EXPECTATIONS

Full participation at all concerts and events is expected. There will be set-up and/or clean-up duties assigned as well as a pre-concert CALL time. Audience participation is also an integral part of the concert for the performers. Please speak with me immediately if there is a scheduling conflict. An UNEXCUSED absence for performance results in a participation deduction from your final grade.

CONCERT ATTIRE/UNIFORMS

Appropriate concert attire, including options for uniforms, will be notified in advance. Dressing for performances counts towards professionalism and participation marks¹.

ASSESSMENT

- Technical Skill 40%
 - IMPROVEMENT²: Improvement in some or all of the following areas: pitch, tone, diction, phrasing, musicality, and/or interpretation.
 - SINGING ASSESSMENTS: Completion of technical and skill-based assessments
- Participation 40%
 - PREPAREDNESS: Being in place, ready to participate with ALL required materials: pencil, music, folder/binder at the start of class.
 - o PROFESSIONALISM: Professional conduct in-class and at performances
 - PARTICIPATION: a willing active attempt at all aspects of the course. This can include but not be limited to, accepting challenges, encouraging others, and helping in the setup and tear-down of performances.
- PERFORMANCE 20%
 - LIVE PERFORMANCE: Success within live performance settings and scenarios in regards to preparation, execution, delivery, and attempt.

Please note, there is no final exam for this course. The performances count as significant assessments in lieu of a written exam.

COVID-19

Severe acute respiratory syndrome coronavirus 2 (SARS-CoV-2), the causative virus for coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19), is reported to be highly transmissible through respiratory droplets and aerosols emitted during coughing, sneezing, speaking and
