We would like to thank the Coast Salish people, specifically the Skwxwú7mesh Nation and the səlilwətał on whose unceded traditional territory the North Vancouver School District resides. We value the opportunity to learn, share and grow on this traditional territory today and always.

Orange Shirt Day - Every Child Matters

Thursday, September 29 is Orange Shirt Day. Orange Shirt Day is a legacy of the St. Joseph Mission residential school commemoration event held in Williams Lake, BC, Canada, in the spring of 2013. It grew out of Phyllis' story of having her shiny new orange shirt taken away on her first day of school at the Mission, and it has become an opportunity to keep the discussion on all aspects of residential schools happening annually. Orange Shirt Day is also an opportunity for First Nations, local governments, schools, and communities to come together in the spirit of reconciliation and hope for generations of children to come. http://bit.ly/2m5z2v0 Please wear your orange shirt on September 29!

Truth and Reconciliation Week — September 26 - September 30

Truth and Reconciliation Week is a five-day national event that focuses on important conversations including the truths of the Indigenous treaties, First Nations, Métis, and Inuit land claims, and the residential school system.


We are a peanut and nut aware school. Please be mindful of the policy in your child's classroom as we have several students and staff with life threatening allergies to peanuts/nuts.
