Dear Boundary Families,

We want to begin by wishing our Boundary families who are embarking on the celebration of Diwali, all the best for good health, happiness, and an abundance of light over the next few days and into this coming year. This is the time of year that our daylight hours noticeably dwindle, and we (usually) begin to prepare for and experience darker, wetter, and colder days. We would like to remind everyone that being prepared for sudden changes in weather should be top of mind right now, and that we would like to avoid being lulled into apathy by these unexpectedly warm days. Please continue to prepare your children and families for the weather changes that will be upon us soon.

This coming week, on October 20th, all students in North Vancouver will also be participating in the Great BC Shake Out. Throughout the year we engage in regular Emergency Preparedness Drills at school, and this includes regular Earthquake preparedness and drills. Did you know that you can also participate at home, with

your family! Please visit <u>Earthquake Preparedness BC | The Great British Columbia ShakeOut (shakeoutbc.ca)</u> for ways to prepare yourselves. While potential earthquake hazards depend on your location, everywhere in British Columbia is considered at high risk in relation to the rest of Canada. For example, on January 26, 1700, a magnitude 9 earthquake (like the 2011 Tohoku earthquake off the coast of Japan) shook the entire province as well as Washington, Oregon, and California, and generated a massive tsunami (source: www.shakeoutbc.ca).

Please mark your calendars for the Provincial Professional Day this coming Friday, October 21st. This is the first time in 2 years that educators across the province will be engaging in large scale Professional Development activities between School Districts. Our staff is very excited to extend their professional learning with provincial colleagues once again and to then bring this back to Boundary School.

Wheels on the School Grounds


