### Dear Boundary Families,

We wanted to begin by thanking all of you for your patience, flexibility, and understanding this past Friday morning, when many of you, including the Boundary School Site, experienced a full electric blackout. The timing was perhaps one of the most difficult situations for a school of 400 students and staff to navigate because it was so close to the first entrance bell. This left us with mere minutes to consult with District personnel, assemble staff, follow safety plans, and then to communicate a plan to families while many of you were already on your way to school! A handful of students joined us in the building, supervised in a central location, while the rest of the staff readied their classrooms by moving furniture to create more space near windows and natural light and significantly changing plans for the day. Given the proximity of the downed power lines and the continuing high winds, we were preparing for a long, dark day. Fortunately, the power came back on for us and we wanted to thank you all again for your understanding and flexibility at that time. The Boundary Staff did an excellent job of moving forward with safety plans, supporting students, and shifting practice at a moment's notice.

It's been a busy, fun weekend! We also wanted to thank our Boundary PAC for setting up the most incredible community sporting event to help fundraise for Boundary! We saw many families at the North Van. Wolf Pack Hockey game this afternoon as they beat the White Rock Whalers 7-2! The students in the crowd were cheering on their favourite players, remembering many of them from our last Monday's school visit. Boundary's National Anthem singers, led by Mrs. Nancy Dale, were absolutely amazing!! It was great to see so many families out supporting our local athletes, student performers, and fundraising for Boundary!

Snow! Snow! Snow!... is on the way. Please be prepared for this exciting and sometimes treacherous West Coast event over the next couple of days. Students will be outside playing and will be much more comfortable with a warm jacket, toque, mitts, boots, and pants if possible.

### Recycling Drive for the Boundary Grade 7 Class of 2023

At the Express kiosk, enter the code 604 903 3260 (easy to remember, it is the school phone number), print off a label, stick onto your (clear) bag of returnables, scan the barcode, and deposit the bag. All money collected will go directly towards the grad fund. This will be ongoing for the rest of the school year - until the end of May.






# Sheeps in a Pen
