#### Litterless Lunch

## Reminders

#### **British Columbia Training & Education Savings Grant Information**

In British Columbia, families are encouraged to start early planning and financial preparation for their children's post-secondary education or training programs. To aid with this effort, the B.C. Government will provide \$1,200 to qualifying children via the B.C. Training and Education Savings Grant (BCTESG).

Children can request the grant between their 6th birthday and the day before they turn 9. Both the child and the parent or guardian must reside in British Columbia at the time of application and possess a valid Social Insurance Number. (http://bit.ly/3yg7zsM)

#### Student Learning Survey Reminder

The Student Learning Survey (SLS), administered annually by the Ministry of Education and Child Care, is open to students in Grades 4, 7, 10 and 12, their parents/guardians, and staff and administrators in B.C. public schools. The survey covers a range of topics, providing a comprehensive picture of the educational experience in B.C. public schools and valuable insight for addressing current needs and trends.

#### Recycling Drive for the Boundary Grade 7 Class of 2023 is Ongoing!

A reminder that the Grade 7 recycling drive is ongoing throughout this school year. You can return cans, bottles, and milk and other recyclable cartons using the Return It Express system at any time. At the Express Kiosk, enter the following code; 604 903 3260 (the school phone number).

Then, print off a label, stick onto your clear bag of recycling, remember to scan the barcode! and deposit the bag. Note that we are unable to use the bin drop off at an Express-and-Go location (e.g. in the Superstore car park), as the access procedure for the bins was changed and only the account holder may access. Please return to a depot (e.g. opposite Park & Tilford).


