## Please Keep Your Child Home When Sick

We would like to remind you of the importance of keeping your child home from school if they are feeling unwell. When deciding whether to send your child to school, please consider their ability to rest, learn, and avoid infecting others.

If your child has a fever, is too ill to participate in normal school activities, or has a suspected or confirmed communicable disease (such as COVID-19, Norovirus, Whooping Cough, Influenza, Strep Throat, Chicken Pox, Measles, or any undiagnosed rash), we ask that you keep them home until they are no longer contagious or until advised by a healthcare provider.

Additionally, if your child is experiencing vomiting or diarrhea, it is recommended that you keep them home until they are no longer exhibiting symptoms.

Please remember that by keeping your child home when they are sick, you are not only protecting their health and ability to recover, but also the health and well-being of other students and staff members.

Thank you for your cooperation and support in helping to maintain a healthy and safe learning environment for everyone.
