Creative thinking is closely connected to positive communication skills. Creativity grows from understanding different perspectives and then adding you own thoughts. Before you can communicate what you are thinking to others, you need to know what you are feeling. Everyone feels a lot of different feelings. We feel these feelings in our bodies. Some feelings are comfortable, and others are uncomfortable, but all of them are okay! Take the time to notice what feelings you have. Pay attention to clues in your boy and in the situation to help you understand how you feel.
