WE THOUGHT YOU'D LIKE TO KNOW...

February is always a time when we engage and focus classroom activities and learning about 'kindness'. Although this is a year-round expectation, we often need reminders and focused instruction on the 'knowledge', the 'doing' and the 'understanding' of what kindness is, what it looks and feels like, and why it is so important for everyone in a community. When we all work together to accept and celebrate differences and to lift each other up with kindness and love, the community becomes strengthened, enriched, and productive. When students have a sense of belonging in their school community, they are better able to learn and thrive. Please ask your child about their lessons, classroom conversations, and their own 'kindness' actions.

Continuing our learning about the contributions of Black Canadians, this week we focussed on *Willie O'Ree* (first Black player in the NHL), *Violet King* (first Black female lawyer called to the bar in 1954), *Mary Ann Shad* (American-Canadian anti-slavery activist, journalist, publisher, teacher, and lawyer), *George Bonga* (famous Voyageur who paddled through central Canada), Black families who founded "*Africville*," a small community in Halifax, and *Joe Fortes* (the first lifeguard and swim instructor in Vancouver)

The coming week 12-16 and the following (19-23) will be shorter 4-day weeks, with a Professional Day next Friday and the Provincial Family Day holiday on Monday, February 19th. Next Friday, all educators throughout the School District will be engaged in professional learning opportunities. We value this time to add to our practice and to bring new knowledge, skills, and understanding into school. We hope that all of you will be able to take advantage of this coming weekend to engage in family activities that celebrate and connect with each other.

And finally, wishing all families who recognize or celebrate Chinese New Year to enjoy the "Year of the Dragon" celebrations happening this weekend. Dragon is powerful, endlessly energetic, and full of vitality, goal-oriented yet idealistic and romantic, and a visionary leader. They know exactly who they are and possess the keenest sense of self among the 12 zodiacs of Chinese astrology.

Our lessons and learnings with the Core Competencies this month continue with:

Communication, being able to give and receive thoughtful feedback, is part of creative thinking and makes all of our work better. Creativity includes working hard, on purpose, on skills that you need to develop to make your ideas work. Creative thinkers persevere. They are good at 'having a go' and then using their experiences to make their next try even better. Creative thinkers always "try, try again!".



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Why is creative thinking important?

- Creative thinking is at the heart of invention and innovation. Sir Ken Robinson said: "Creativity is putting your imagination to work, and it's produced the most extraordinary results in human culture".
- Positive self-talk helps is the best friend of creativity. Susan L. Taylor reminds us that: "Every problem has a solution. Stress and worry, they solve nothing. What they do is block creativity. You are not even able to think about the solutions (when you worry)".

Every two weeks we are recognizing students who exemplify the attributes taught through the Second Step lessons.

Today we are recognizing students who are *original and accepts differences in others*. It's great to be different and to let others be as they are. Thank you to the following students for shining bright at Boundary!
