## Boundary Buddy Bench

In September the school installed a brightly coloured bench near the playgrounds behind the school to help kids be part of play. A child might use this bench for a variety of reasons. Maybe their friends aren't at school today, maybe they want to make new friends, maybe they want to play something different or maybe they are having a problem with their friends and need to try something new. Whatever the reason, the **Buddy Bench** is a simple signal that this child needs a friend wants other kids to reach out and invite them to join.

## Here are a few simple rules for using the **Buddy Bench** to help us get started:

- Before you sit on the **Buddy Bench**, think of something you would like to do. Do your best to ask someone else to play with you.
- When you see someone on the bench, ask that person to play with you.
- The bench isn't for chatting with friends. Only sit there if you can't find anyone to play with.
- While you're sitting on the bench, look around for a game you can join.
- If you see something you want to do or a friend you want to talk to, join them!
- If you're sitting on the bench, play with the first schoolmate who invites you.
- Keep playing with your new friends and when you see someone else on the Buddy
  Bench, make sure to invite them to play with you!
