We thank the PAC for supporting the Black History Month workshops for students presented by Presentation House. The speakers shared their knowledge and enthusiasm, and the students were very engaged and moved by their learnings.

With 2 weeks to go until the March break, ensure you have signed up for a conference with your child's teacher. We will have 3 early dismissal days on March 12, 13, and 14 to accommodate these conferences. Please note that the format for conferences will be different from class to class. This is an excellent time to reflect on your child's learning so far this school year, and to set some goals for continued growth for the balance of this year. Celebrate, encourage, and let your child know that learning can be hard work, but it can also lead to new adventures, new skills, and deep satisfaction. Be a learner alongside your child and continue to keep in touch with your child's teacher and with other community opportunities to help with this important, lifelong journey. Did you know that in one calendar year a child spends 7800 hours at home and 900 hours at school? Children are learning all the time, in a variety of locations, and with a variety of people. We are thankful for the continued collaboration between home/school/community resources.

Why is creative thinking important?

- Creative thinking is at the heart of invention and innovation. Sir Ken Robinson said: "Creativity is putting your imagination to work, and it's produced the most extraordinary results in human culture".
- Positive self-talk helps is the best friend of creativity. Susan L. Taylor reminds us that: "Every problem has a solution. Stress and worry, they solve nothing. What they do is block creativity. You are not even able to think about the solutions (when you worry)".
