- Mathematics 10 and 11 or 12 (8 credits)
- Physical Health Education 10 (PE, Conditioning, Dance or Academy) (4 credits)
- Science 10 and 11 or 12 (8 credits)
- Social Studies 10 and 11 or 12 (8 credits)
- 7 electives (28 credits)
- Careers Life Education 10 (4 credits)
- Careers Life Connections 12 (4 credits)

Total: 80 credits (52 mandatory + 28 elective credits)

- 16 credits must be at the Grade 12 level
- 4 credits must have an Indigenous focus (Lit studies 11 First Peoples)




MATH FLOW CHART

Work Experience 11/12

- Sometimes, students are offered future and/or summer employment by their placement supervisors who have been impressed by their skills and work ethic
- Work Experience is typically offered to Grade 11 and 12 students
- Grade 10 students may be considered if space permits



Peak Performance

- Minimum of 15 hours per week year-round of discipline specific training
- Minimum of C+ average and satisfactory work habits based on previous year's report card.
- Competition and/or performance at the regional, provincial, or national level
- Recommendation of coach or person responsible for training program
- One complete application form with all necessary documents submitted to your counsellor
- Students must reapply every year
- Application Due Date: May 1
- Approval of application by the Principal at the student's school.


