
FIRST WEEK OF SCHOOL EASTVIEW SEPTEMBER 6-9, 2016

Transition to New Classes: Safety and Meeting Requests

We will be providing coffee for parents in the activity room from 8:30-9:30. On Thursday, September 8 we look forward to working with parents in support of a positive transition; students will be anxious about their new class and will benefit from a calm, safe and open environment. Please help by keeping the hallways calm and clear enough for students to move freely. If you have questions about your child's placement, please visit the office to request a meeting. I will be available to meet starting Friday, September 9.

Safe Student Drop-off and Pick-up

We learned that stopping in the cul-du sac is against City Bylaw. Plan to well walk, bike or roll to school. If you do drive, please use alternate drop off areas. Many parents have reported unsafe situations when the cul-du-sac has been used for drop-off and pick up.

Parking

The parking lots are for staff use only. We are working with the school district to designate some spots for midday student pick-up and drop-off. There are a few drop-off parking spots on the north side of 18th street and a few parking spots on the south side. Parking at Mt. Olivet Church is a great option as they have graciously offered parents to use their space.

Allergies

We have children who have a life-threatening allergy to some foods. We are a nut, banana, dairy, kiwi, egg, fish and shellfish aware school. Please carefully review our September anaphylaxis notice to identify the allergies in your child's classroom and communicate with your child's teacher to ensure safe practices. In support, all classrooms encourage hand washing and students NOT sharing foods. *Important: If your child has allergies, please be sure to share your child's needs with the school office.* Also...

All schools in the North Vancouver School District are a scent free zone. We have students/parents and community members who suffer significantly from perfumes and specific scents. Refraining from wearing perfumes, and strong smelling scents are a great way to improve the learning conditions for our students, parents and entire community.

Family Groups

Staff decided to continue with family groups this year. The goal is to help students learn more about staff, to meet a variety of students, and to provide immediate leadership opportunities for our grade 7s. Last year, many students mentioned the benefits to meeting students and staff in the school and really appreciated the connections they made. It is a great way to enhance the belonging and help our students feel safe at Eastview!

New Boiler for Eastview

There is currently some construction underway in our front foyer and maintenance room. I met with the contractor and maintenance department and there is a great understanding to maintain the school learning environment. A temporary "wall" has been built to designate the work area. Noise will be kept to a minimum during school hours, and dust etc. will be virtually non-existent. We are very thankful for this work! The benefits to having a new boiler are going to be noticed:

- significant reduction of greenhouse gas emissions
- improved indoor air quality and temperature control
- improved background noise
- back up system included
- cost efficient
