





Peak Performance

- A non-credit scheduling option for elite-level student athletes and performers in Grades 8 to 12
- Minimum 15 hours per week of specific training, C+ average, and satisfactory work habits
- Students are still required to complete grade 10 courses needed for graduation (ex. taking PHE 10 online)
- Scheduling is complex so please apply before course schedules are complete and go out to students
