



Black History Month

Many classes at Lynnmour/Xá7elcha are learning about and honouring Black History Month over the course of February. In December of 1995 the House of Commons unanimously carried a motion declaring February Black History Month and the learning and understanding has been growing ever since.

For all of us, it is important that we are open to and offer an opportunity to celebrate contributions of all communities who have worked to make these lands a place for us all to learn, share and grow.



Local history - Did you know?

Harry Jerome was a black athlete who grew up in Saskatchewan

and North Vancouver- he attended Ridgeway Elementary, and North Vancouver High School as a student. When his family arrived in North Vancouver, the neighbourhood created a petition against the family because they were black. They were forced to move to another neighbourhood because of this racial discrimination. Once known as the fastest man in the world he was the first Canadian to hold a world track record. His contributions to athletics led him to being awarded the Order of Canada in 1971 and the title "Athlete of the Century" by the province of British Columbia. He created the Premier Sports Award, still utilized for recognizing achievements in athletics and became a high school PE teacher in Vancouver.

His motto was one we can all live by: NEVER GIVE UP!








ADST and Divisions 1, 3, 4
