
Please support our students in taking care of the books they borrow so that our resources are available for our community to use.

Orange Shirt Day/National Truth and Reconciliation - September 30

Orange Shirt Day has been established in recognition of the harm done by the Indian Residential School System across Canada. The experiences of those who survived their time in this system (and those who did not) are being shared more and more. We are learning about the instant impact of these "schools" and the greater, long term impact that continues to be felt in communities all over. We encourage families to explore resources, have discussions, and for students to share their understandings of what they are learning about the residential school system.
