The Moose Hide Campaign began as a BC-born Indigenous-led grassroots movement to engage men and boys in ending violence towards women and children. A cornerstone of the Moose Hide Campaign is the moose hide pin. Wearing the pin signifies your commitment to honour, respect and protect the women and children in your life and speak out against genderbased and domestic violence.

Moose hide is a symbol of taking a stand against violence and undoing the effects of Residential Schools. Post-Secondary BC (PSBC) supports high school students and their parents by providing the information they need to help make the best post-secondary education decisions. Cabaret in the Cove is a 19+ event.


Celebrating Learning




POETRY CLUB
