Black Pioneers in British Columbia

In 1858, nearly 800 free Blacks left the oppressive racial conditions of San Francisco for a new life on Vancouver Island. Governor James Douglas had invited them here as promising settlers. Though still faced with intense discrimination, these pioneers enriched the political, religious and economic life of the colony. For example, Mifflin Gibbs became a prominent politician; Charles and

Nancy Alexander initiated the Shady Creek Methodist Church; John Deas established a salmon cannery; and the group formed one of the earliest colonial militia units, the Victoria Pioneer Rifle Corps.



Recent Career Exploration Experiences for Students

TWO DAYS IN THE LIFE OF AN RCMP OFFICER CAREER WORKSHOP



Students from across the North Vancouver School District, including six students from Seycove, took part in an interactive two-day event hosted by the North Vancouver RCMP and NVSD. On day one, students were introduced to various members of the NVRCMP who shared their career pathways to becoming an RCMP officer. The students then got to work and tried out radio communications, crime scene investigation, note taking, law look up, suspect de-escalation tactics and more.

On day two, the workshop took place at the North Vancouver RCMP Detachment and students took a tour of the facility and were introduced to the various roles that make up the detachment including the non-emergency call centre team, Special Crimes Unit, Emergency Response Team, General Duty officers, traffic and more.

A big Thank You to the NVRCMP team, especially Cst. Bams who put together all the scenarios and guests. Students who attended the event were really impressed with how much they learned about careers in policing and a few students now intend to make policing their career.

LIONS GATE HOSPITAL BIOMEDICAL ENGINEERING LAB TOUR



Seycove students had the rare opportunity to visit the biomedical engineering lab at Lions Gate Hospital last week. The tour was led by lab supervisor, Tyler Gibson, who demonstrated the role of the Biomedical Engineering Lab Techs in the hospital. Students saw some of the machines used in the hospital including EKGs, ventilators, monitoring systems, feeding machines, electrosurgical units and more. Gibson demonstrated the importance of the lab techs to ensure the proper operation of the machines and their vital role in fixing the machines. Students got hands-on demonstrations on some of the machines including performing a noninvasive 'operation' using a laparoscope camera and grippers.



Students interested in career development and exploration events and opportunities like these can visit the Work Experience office. Opportunities are posted around the school and shared on Teams.
