Graeme's Construction Work Experience Placement with Naikoon Contracting

Work Experience Placement to Apprenticeship: Graeme's Journey to Red Seal



Graeme's interest in carpentry is what led him to visit the Work Experience (WEX) office to see what kinds of opportunities were available for him to better understand the trade. With the guidance of Seycove's WEX Facilitator, Janice Knapp, Graeme's journey in carpentry gained momentum. Janice connected Graeme with Naikoon Contracting for a two-week placement last summer. Eager to learn and armed with his passion for carpentry, Graeme arrived at the job site each morning, ready to tackle tasks ranging from site clean-up to more hands-on responsibilities.

During the second week, Graeme found himself right in the midst of the action, part of the crew demolishing a property on South Granville. The experience was transformative, as the sounds of hammers and saws echoed through the job site, solidifying Graeme's desire to continue his journey towards becoming a carpenter. Amidst the debris and the thrill of creating something new, Graeme discovered that carpentry was where his true passion lay, "I enjoyed seeing all the other trades in action, but working at Naikoon confirmed I want to continue in carpentry."

Motivated by his newfound clarity, Graeme took the initiative to pursue his dream further. Knowing that his heart was

set on obtaining the Red Seal in carpentry, he reached out to the WEX team to explore more opportunities. Thanks to the efforts of NVSD District Careers Teacher, Jennifer Kinakin, Graeme secured a spot in the upcoming BCIT Level 1 Apprenticeship Carpentry Program in February, with Naikoon Contracting serving as his proud sponsor.

Starting in February, Graeme is all set to embark on a dual journey of earning and learning. He'll be working for Naikoon, gaining hands-on experience in the field, while also attending the BCIT program to further sharpen his carpentry skills. Expressing his enthusiasm for the upcoming chapter, Graeme stated, "I'm looking forward to getting paid well in a career that I'm really passionate about. I am excited to start so young towards my Red Seal certification in carpentry and know that I can take this skill with me anywhere."

As Graeme steps into this promising future, he carries not only the tools of his trade but also the invaluable lessons learned through hard work, dedication, and the unwavering support of those who believed in his carpentry dreams.
