
National Indigenous Veterans Day—November 8

November 8th is observed as National Indigenous Veterans Day, a day of remembrance and commemoration for Indigenous Veterans.

Our North Vancouver Community gathered together at Whey-ah-Wichen to commemorate and learn about Tsleil-Waututh Nation Veterans (photo right).

Established in 1994, this important day is an opportunity to recognize the military service and sacrifices made by First Nations, Inuit, and Métis Peoples.

More than 12,000 Indigenous Peoples served in the First and Second World Wars, as well as the Korean War. These courageous men and women left their home communities to join the fight for freedom. They were skilled marksmen, talented scouts, fearless soldiers and code talkers. Their bravery and skill has been recognised by countries around the world. This proud tradition of service to our country continues to this day.



The Poppy is worn each year during the Remembrance period to honour Canada's Fallen. The Legion also encourages the wearing of a Poppy for the funeral of a Veteran and for any commemorative event honouring Fallen Veterans. Thanks to the millions of Canadians who wear the Legion's lapel Poppy each November, the little red flower has never died, and the memories of those who fell in battle remain strong.



Safe & Caring Schools

erase | building safe school communities

get help now \rightarrow

CIASE is about building safe and caring school communities. This includes empowering students, families, educators and the community partners who support them to get help with challenges, report concerns to schools, and learn about complex issues facing students. erase started in 2004 through the provincial government's Safe, Caring and Orderly Schools Strategy, and has since evolved.

We encourage families to review the resources and information found on the <u>erase website</u> with your children, including about online safety, mental health and well-being, substance abuse, bullying, racism, sexual orientation and gender identity (SOGI) and more. There is also a <u>reporting tool to get help and support</u>.

This month, the school district and school websites will feature erase on the homepage rotating banner. We are doing this to increase awareness of this resource. You can expect to see erase shared on school district and school websites periodically throughout the school year.



The BC Ministry of Education is offering **free**, **virtual** <u>erase</u> **learning sessions for families**, which will be held on November 8, 28, and 30, focusing on establishing safe, caring, and respectful digital communities. Everyone is welcome to attend!

The sessions are recommended for Parents/Caregivers/Grandparents and youth aged 10 and up as a way to facilitate the conversation of safe and caring use of technology at home and in the community. The session covers all things digital, from how to be a good digital citizen, the criminal consequences of cyberbullying, and how to report and receive support in cases of sexting/sextortion. Some of the most prominent concerns currently surrounding use of social media platforms smartphones, and artificial intelligence will be discussed.




Sports, Recreation and Healthcare Fair - Nov 17


