Updates & Reminders

Student Pick-up & Drop-off

At the start and end of the school day the Seycove driveway and roads bordering our school are busy. Students are encouraged to walk, bike, or roll to school. If you are dropping off or picking up your child please only do so in the designated drop off area in front of the cafeteria on the side of the school. Please do not stop elsewhere in the driveway.

Student Parking

Students driving to school must register their vehicle at the main office. Unregistered vehicles parking in school lots may be subject to towing.

Health & Safety Reminders

Students need to stay home if they are not feeling well.

Students should wash their hands upon arriving at school and throughout the day.

Seycove Timetable and Tutorial Time

This year, all secondary Schools across the NVSD have a new <u>Semester timetable</u>. The school year is divided into 2 halves:

Semester 1 (September 5 – January 26) Semester 2 (February 1 – June 21)

Generally speaking, students will have four classes each semester. These classes rotate each day as shown in the timetable.

We are once again offering a daily tutorial time from 8:31am to 9:10am. Students are encouraged to access support from their teachers during this time and teachers may request that students attend tutorial time if needed. Unless teachers request students to attend, attendance is not required at tutorials, but students are strongly encouraged to access this support on a regular basis for extra help, enrichment, or for "catch-up" if they are falling behind.

Student Activity Fee - \$36.60 (Grades 10, 11 and 12) \$47.05 (Grades 8 and 9 – Agenda Included)Each student at Seycove is charged a Student Activity Fee. This year the fee is set at \$36.60 and \$47.05. This fee supports student activities, student awards and recognition events, other special events and assemblies.

Graduation Activity Fee (Grade 12s Only) - \$47.05

This fee is used to defray the cost of the graduation ceremony and other grad activities throughout the school year.

Supplemental Fees (by course)

Supplemental fees may be charged for goods and services associated with optional enrichment activities and take home items that extend learning outcomes for students beyond their basic educational program. Speeding





Traffic safety in our school zone and surrounding area roads is everyone's responsibility.

Drivers, please abide by the posted speed limit of

15 km on school grounds and 30 km for Strathcona.


Don't forget:

Black Bears

Bears have been spotted recently around Seycove, we would like to remind our students, families and neighbours what to do when you encounter a bear. (From the North Shore Black Bear Society)

IF YOU MEET A BEAR

- Try to remain as calm as possible. Black bears are calm animals and by staying calm, you reduce startling the bear.
- Communicate that you are not a danger by using a calm tone to speak to them in any language.
- Show the bear you are respectful of their personal space by slowly distancing yourself.
- Ensure the bear has an exit.

Never intentionally approach bears. It is very rare for black bears to make contact with humans, but they will not appreciate you encroaching on their personal space and you could pressure defensive behaviour. When bears are pressured by our presence, they show subtle stress signals such as excessive yawning, pretending to eat, moaning, huffing, salivating and jaw-popping.

Approaching bears for photographs can pressure them to feel defensive. Bears may be comfortable with people at a distance but the boundaries of personal space are unique to each individual. **Never approach a bear intentionally.**

What is Skilled Trades Certification?

Skilled Trades Certification is commonly referred to as mandatory or compulsory trades across Canada. Under Skilled Trades Certification, uncertified workers in selected trades will have a one-year transition period to get registered as an apprentice or become a certified journeyperson.

With more than **85,000**job openings
expected in the next decade, there has never been a better time to join the skilled trades.

Why is it *important?*

While British Columbia has a strong and effective trades training system that offers multiple pathways for individuals to achieve certification, it has not had a mandatory trades certification system for two decades. Skilled Trades Certification will:

- Formally recognize the skills of current and future trades workers
- Boost prestige for the trades
- Help to draw more people to trades careers and keep them working as the industry's needs shift over time

When and how will it be *implemented*?

Implementation is currently underway, starting with seven electrical and mechanical trades—construction electrician, industrial electrician, powerline technician, refrigeration & air conditioning mechanic, gasfitter A & B, steamfitter/pipefitter and sheet metal worker.

Each trade has a one-year transition period from December 1, 2022, which will allow uncertified workers to register as an apprentice or become certified by challenging a certification exam.

Employers can prepare for implementation by ensuring workers are registered apprentices or certified journey people and making any adjustments necessary to ensure their successful transition to Skilled Trades Certification.

Three additional automotive trades will be introduced as Skilled Trades Certification trades in 2024 and will also have one year to transition once announced.
