#### Jump Start:

Admin welcomed students back with a school-wide online assembly, we called "Jump Start". This assembly was designed to re-set expectations, re-energize our students, and set a positive tone for the remainder of the school year.

During the Jump Start assembly, we provided meaningful reminders to students on several key topics that are essential for their success, both academically and personally. Some of the key points we covered are listed below:

- 1. Attendance: We emphasized the importance of attending all classes regularly and being punctual. Consistent attendance is crucial for academic progress and staying engaged in the learning process.
- 2. Cell Phone Use: We discussed responsible cell phone use and the importance of minimizing distractions during class time

	to enhance learning and focus. As outlined in our Seycove School Policy, cell phones should be turned off and put away	
	during class time, unless otherwise invited by the classroom teacher.
