Placement Letters

As we begin to plan for next year, informal conversations among staff members are often around possible class organizations. We are ever committed to building the best learning environment for all students and as such our variables are many. Parents as partners in this process are important. Please let the office know as soon as possible if your child(ren) will not be returning to Westview next September. Having this information is very important to our planning for next year. In June we will begin organizing divisions for the 2017/18 school year. Using the following criteria, Westview staff devotes a substantial amount of thought and effort into the process of building classes:

- (a) Balanced instructional groups:
- 1. Academic ability,
- 2. Work habits.
- 3. Learning styles

- (b) Positive social groups:
- 1. Peer support/conflicts,
- 2. Gender equity,
- 3. Positive leaders
- (c) Additional information
- 1. School Based Resource Team (*SBRT) recommendations,
- 2. History of combined vs straight class placements,
- 3. Parent information.
- 4. The sharing of resources for students

Should you have any information and/or concerns regarding your son/daughter's placement for 2017/18, please submit them in writing to Ms. Orr no later than May 26th. Letters received after this date will not be accepted. Letters should address:

- your child's educational needs
- your child's social/emotional needs
- information about peer conflict

Your letter cannot be to request a specific teacher. Letters containing staff names will not be considered in the class building process. Please understand that we carefully consider every student placement in order to produce the best possible educational environment for all children. While we make every effort to take your requests into account, regrettably, they cannot always be fully accommodated.
