Up to date as of February 6. Complete report below.

-Expenditures have come from gaming. Protecting general account for technology purchase -PAC social cancelled, refunds issued by E-Brite

-PST application sent in late, rejected. Decided not to re-apply as the labour needed was not worth the \$219.00

-Santa's Breakfast - money inadvertently paid from Trust account instead of Gaming Account. Treasurer and Windsor admin will correct.

-Updated budget procedures to allow teachers to make requests throughout year instead of at beginning of school year.

-Request from library for 10 e-readers \$2794.03 and audio books. We can support purchase of e-readers but cannot use Gaming funds for gift cards for e-books. Suggestion that library use budget to buy some e-books as well as physical books

Windsor teams who make it to provincials in their activity (field hockey or chess club or any Windsor team)

- Pedestrian safety: After consultation with school and Windsor Pac, district has agreed to install crosswalks at Lytton Street and entrance to Windsor; asphalt pedestrian path between Lytton and lane to Seymour Dance; crosswalk at lane to Seymour dance; pedestrian lane with concrete barrier on lane to Seymour dance; and will cut back vegetation and install "No Parking" signs on lane that exits lane from back parking lot. The loop that is at the back of Windsor will also be made "one-way traffic". This should be done spring of 2023. Thank you to Windsor administration and Graham Gilley, PAC Chair, for making this safety change.
