#### A. Call to Order

Board Chair Kulvir Mann called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m.

## B.1. School District No. 44 (North Vancouver) Annual Budget Bylaw for Fiscal Year 2023/24

In accordance with the School Act, boards of education must adopt its budget bylaw on or before June 30, 2023, for the 2023/24 fiscal year. Superintendent Dr. Pius Ryan introduced this agenda item and welcomed Assistant Superintendents Chris Atkinson and Arlene Martin, Executive Director of Human Resources Scott Stanley, and Director of Financial Services Helena Drury.

The presenters provided an overview of the budget development process and the preliminary planning assumptions, highlighting student enrolment projections, revenues, staffing, salaries and benefits. The presentation included specific impacts to the Board's Strategic Plan Goals for 2021-2031.

Input received from consultation with the school district partner groups incorporated into the 2023/24 financial plan. Concluding the presentation, potential risk assumptions for the next year were summarized and the approval process was highlighted.

Trustee Daniel Anderson, Chair of the Audit Committee provided comments concerning the deliberations at the recent Audit Committee meeting.

The Executive team provided clarification and responded to Trustees' questions.

- Bus Acquisition Program

The Ministry response advised of major capital projects supported to proceed to the next stage, if applicable, as well as minor capital projects from the Ministry's 2023/24 annual capital programs that are approved for funding and are able to proceed to procurement.

- (b) Upon ministerial approval to proceed, commence the capital project(s) and proceed diligently and use its best efforts to complete each capital project substantially as directed by the Minister:
- (c) Observe and comply with any order, regulation, or policy of the Minister as may be applicable to the Board or the capital project(s); and,
- (d) Maintain proper books of account, and other information and documents with respect to the affairs of the capital project(s), as may be prescribed by the Minister.

#### NOW THEREFORE the Board enacts as follows:

- 1. The Capital Bylaw of the Board for the 2023/24 Capital Plan as approved by the Minister, to include the supported capital project(s) specified in the letter addressed to the Secretary-Treasurer and Superintendent, dated March 9, 2023, is hereby adopted.
- 2. This Capital Bylaw may be cited as North Vancouver Capital Bylaw No. 2023/24-CPSD44-01.

Memorandum): Five-Year Capital Plan 2024/25

#### Narration:

Each year, boards of education are required to submit a Five-Year Capital Plan identifying both major and minor capital funding priorities required for their school districts. In late March 2023, the Ministry of Education and Child Care issued instructions identifying the funding programs and requirements for the preparation and submission of the 2024/25 Five-Year Capital Plan. The deadlines for the submissions, using the Capital Asset Planning System online platform, as follows:

- Major Capital Programs June 30, 2023
- Minor Capital Programs September 30, 2023

The staggered deadlines are intended to provide the Ministry with input required to initiate planning for the next budget cycle, while enabling school districts additional time and flexibility to plan over the summer. School districts may wish to provide Major and Minor Capital submissions by the June 30, 2023 deadline.

School districts are required to have a current Long Range Facilities Plan (LRFP) to support major capital priorities identified in their Five-Year Capital Plan submission. The LRFP is to incorporate consideration of demographic changes, enrolment patterns, residential developments planned in the community, facility condition, and capacity utilization.

A consultant was engaged to assist with updating ten-year enrolment projections and emerging priorities for the LRFP. These priorities were used to highlight major capital project requests.

The major capital funding programs require projects to be prioritized over a five-year budget horizon. The current major capital funding programs that are applicable to the North Vancouver School District are:

- Addition/Expansion Program
- Demolition Project
- New School Program
- Replacement/Renovation Program
- Seismic Project
- Site Acquisition Program

The minor capital programs only require funds to be identified for a single budget year. The minor capital funding programs include the following:

- Carbon Neutral Capital Program
- Playground Equipment Program
- School Enhancement Program

#### MAJOR CAPITAL FUNDING PROGRAMS

#### School Addition/Expansion Projects

Priorities based on Long Range Facilities Plan and enrolment projections.

#### **Demolition Program**

This funding is primarily for rural school districts; however, the NVSD has submitted a request with the hope it might be funded.

#### **New School Program**

New school proposed based on long range enrolment projection. This request would be subject to securing a new site.

#### School Replacement/Renovation Projects

Priorities based on a combination of facility condition with consideration to future enrolment.

#### Seismic Program

Requests to updated schools based on Ministry seismic risk assessment.

#### Site Acquisition Program

A funding request to support the acquisition of future elementary school.

#### MINOR CAPITAL FUNDING PROGRAMS

#### Carbon Neutral Capital Program

School districts are limited to five priorities. Projects must contribute to measurable emissions reductions, operational cost savings, align with Capital Asset Management Systems equipment renewal period and LRFP.

#### Playground Equipment Program

Funding eligibility is based on new or replacement playground equipment. Prioritization is given to schools that do not currently have playground equipment, and where students do not have easy access to nearby playground facilities. School districts are limited to three requests for universally accessible playground equipment.

#### School Enhancement Program

School Enhancement Projects are investments that will contribute to the safety and function of the school and will extend the life of the existing asset. Projects and priorities were identified with the use of the Ministry's Capital Asset Management System, consulting reports, and staff input. Eligible projects must be valued at more than \$100,000 but not exceed \$2,000,000. One project must be included that is valued at \$500,000 or less. School districts are limited to a maximum of 5 separate School Enhancement Projects limited to five priorities.

The submissions on the attached summary. are prioritized based on requests from schools, facilities staff assessments, equipment age and condition, community access, proximity to parks, and equity between schools (including equity in terms of play space area to enrolment numbers).



#### **Policy**

In accordance with the Ministry of Education's *Alternate Education School Program Policy*, a board may establish programs or schools that will serve as alternates to those offered in a traditional school or program.

The Board of Education recognizes the diversity of learners in our school district and acknowledges that there may be students that have educational, social, emotional, and/or behavioural needs that require an alternate educational setting and/or program.

The overall responsibility for the establishment and operation of alternate programs or schools within the North Vancouver School District resides with the board of education. The Board of Education will determine the educational program, curriculum delivery, and pedagogical directions of the alternate school or program. The Board of Education's alternate education schools or programs will:

- Meet the requirements of the School Act, Ministerial regulations, policies, procedures, and orders, Board policies, provincial and School District prescribed curriculum, learning outcomes, and widely accepted assessment and evaluation practices and procedures (Policy 209: Student Assessment)
- Address the diverse learning needs of students, foster social/emotional learning, support student achievement, and enable alternate pathways to graduation
- Enhance differentiated instruction and personalized learning at schools throughout the School District
- Support and facilitate the smooth transition of students to and from the alternate education school or program and mainstream schools.

Funding levels and financial support for alternate programs or schools will be consistent with the per student funding provided by the Ministry of Education, and as determined by the Board of Education.

#### Capital Planning Committee Meeting - June 2023

The North Vancouver School District Capital Planning Committee was established to provide information about the Ministry of Education and Child Care's capital planning process and established priorities with representatives from across the school district and external municipal planners. The Committee provides opportunities for input into the need and identification of priority projects for consideration by the Board of Education, assists in identifying capital projects with potential for joint initiative and shared funding opportunities.

The Committee is a District Representative Committee Chaired by Jim MacKenzie, Director of Facilities and Planning, and comprised of one representative from the Board of Education, two representatives of each of the School District employee groups, two representatives from the District Student Leadership Council, two representatives from the North Vancouver Parent Advisory Council and representatives from the City of North Vancouver, the District of North Vancouver and the North Vancouver Recreation and Culture Commission.

The primary purpose of the June meeting was to provide an update on the Ministry's response to the prior years major and minor capital plan submissions and provide refreshed enrolment projections and review the emerging capacity and utilization of schools to inform future capital priorities. The balance of the agenda identified the major and minor capital priorities for the upcoming capital plan submission in the following categories:

- Proposed major capital programs additions, demolition, replacements, seismic upgrades, new schools and site acquisitions; and,
- Proposed minor capital programs School Enhancement Program, Carbon Neutral Capital Program, Playground Equipment Program, Building Envelope Program and Bus Acquisition Program.

The Committee also reviewed a conceptual site plan for the proposed Cloverley Elementary school and conceptual drawings and improvements for the Lynn Valley Elementary Expansion Project.

The meeting concluded following an update on childcare within the school district and recent funding commitments to provide additional before and after care services at both Seymour Heights Elementary and Dorothy Lynas Elementary.

The next Capital Planning Committee Meeting will be scheduled in the fall of 2023.

#### **Emergency Preparedness Committee – June 2023**

Establishing and maintaining safe learning environments for all students and employees is a priority of the North Vancouver Board of Education. The purpose of the Emergency Preparedness Committee is to:

- Provide advice on emergency planning issues referred to the Committee for further examination.
- Monitor aspects of ongoing emergency preparedness planning, particularly relating to schools effectiveness to be prepared and response to various emergencies, and, if necessary, make recommendations.

The Committee is comprised of representatives from all education partner groups including:

- Committee Chair, Cindy O'Krane, Occupational Health and Safety Manager
- Emergency Preparedness Consultant: Jocelyn Hewson
- Communications: Lisa Dalla Vecchia, Communications Manager
- North Vancouver Administrators' Association Representatives: Tim Ireland, Adam Stokes, and Russell Mayert
- North Vancouver Teachers' Association Representative: David Murton
- North Vancouver Parent Advisory Council: Michelle Sawyer

The Emergency Preparedness Committee met bi-monthly during 2022/23. The agenda of each meeting was to review existing initiatives, discuss areas of improvement, and solicit feedback on priority items.

At October's kickoff meeting, the Chair reviewed the recent rollout of the updated / revised Emergency Response Plan and Incident Command System documentation and training. Initiatives of importance include the evacuation plan for students with mobility issues, a questionnaire for members of the committee to help identify the status of emergency equipment within their respective schools, and a potential tabletop exercise. An overview of the Carson Graham Lockdown event (October 2022) was discussed including lessons learned.

In December, the conversation continued regarding how to measure and gather information on emergency preparedness supplies within schools including possible methods for auditing the contents of all emergency containers. The Committee also discussed how to promote the importance of emergency preparedness at schools.

The issuing of a survey to all schools was further discussed in February, with the objective of gathering a snapshot on emergency supplies by school.

At the May meeting, the Chair confirmed that the survey of emergency preparedness supplies had been developed, and that she would be visiting schools to complete. The tabletop exercise has been scheduled on June 27.

#### Policy Review Committee - June 2023

The North Vancouver Board of Education develops and adopts policies as statements of intent to guide the operations of the school district. Board of Education policies reflect the School Act and regulations and align with the Board's mission, mandate and core values. Under the direction of the Superintendent, the North Vancouver School District Policy Review Committee evaluates, reviews, and proposes policies to the Board that reflect current legislative, regulatory, and public policy changes. The Policy Review Committee is a District Representative Committee comprised of two representatives from the Board of Education, two representatives of each of the school district employee groups, two representatives from the District Student Leadership Council, and two representatives from the North Vancouver Parent Advisory Council.

Convening no fewer than four times per school year, the Policy Review Committee:

- Provides advice to the Superintendent respecting which policies require clarification and/or amendment:
- Provides advice to the Superintendent respecting which issues require policy development;
- Reviews and provides advice to the Superintendent respecting drafts of proposed new policies prior to their consideration by the Board.

Throughout the 2022/23 school year, the Policy Review Committee convened six times and discussed the following policies:

- Policy 204: Alternate Education
- Policy 205: Outdoor School
- Policy 206: Continuing Education
- Policy 212: Animals in the Classroom
- Policy 310: Concussion Awareness, Prevention and Management and
- Policy 611: Privacy

The Policy Review Committee also discussed policy related to:

- United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples and the Declaration of the Rights of Indigenous Peoples Act (in particular the 13 objectives for public schooling);
- Anti-Racism; and
- Ableism (policy development is underway)

The Policy Review Committee learned about:

- The working group on Policy 409: Framework for Belonging Administrative Procedures; and
- The Emergency Preparedness Committee

The Policy Review Committee will reconvene in late September 2023.

Narration:

At the June 19, 2018 Public Board meeting, the Board of Education approved the Five-Year Capital Plan that included a new school at the Cloverley site. In March 2020 the Ministry of Education and Child invited the school district to provide a draft concept plan in support of the project. As a result of changing demographics and residential developments in the surrounding areas, the enrolment capacity of the school increased to 60 kindergarten and 525 elementary students, for a total capacity of 585 students. Through the detailed definition phase of the project, the approved option includes 300 M² Neighborhood Learning Centre space, Greenhouse Gas (GHG) reduction measures and construction with mass timber, costed at \$64.4 million.

Current provincial government policy requires Boards of Education to share in the cost of major capital projects. Cost share contributions for school districts are set on a case-by-case basis and are dependent on the current financial situation of the school district. Confirmation of a school district's contribution is required prior to the Ministry seeking a funding decision from Treasury Board. At the January 24, 2023 In Camera Meeting, the Board of Education approved a \$3.0 million contribution toward the construction of the project.

In partnership with the City of North Vancouver, the City has committed to funding \$3.5 million towards the contribution of a child care centre at the Cloverley site. The school district will also submit an application to the ChildCareBC New Spaces Fund for additional provincial government funding. The combined funding, from the Neighborhood Learning Centre space, the City, and further provincial funding will create an exciting new opportunity to support childcare.

Construction is expected to start Fall 2024 and be ready for students in time for the 2026/27 school year.
