Family of Schools model

Each Family of Schools (FoS) is represented by the K to 12 learning continuum and includes a secondary school and the related elementary schools. The purpose of this model is to build and maintain community within secondary school neighbourhoods, enhance staff collaboration and development. and optimize student supports.

Each FoS is supported by a director of instruction, human resource manager, FoS leader, FoS teacher leader, school district administrators and itinerant specialist staff. The FoS Leadership Team meets regularly throughout the school year with an assistant superintendent, principals and viceprincipals to determine priorities and plans of support.
