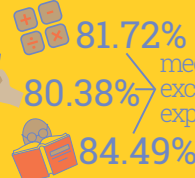

Completion Rate: 6 Year Model



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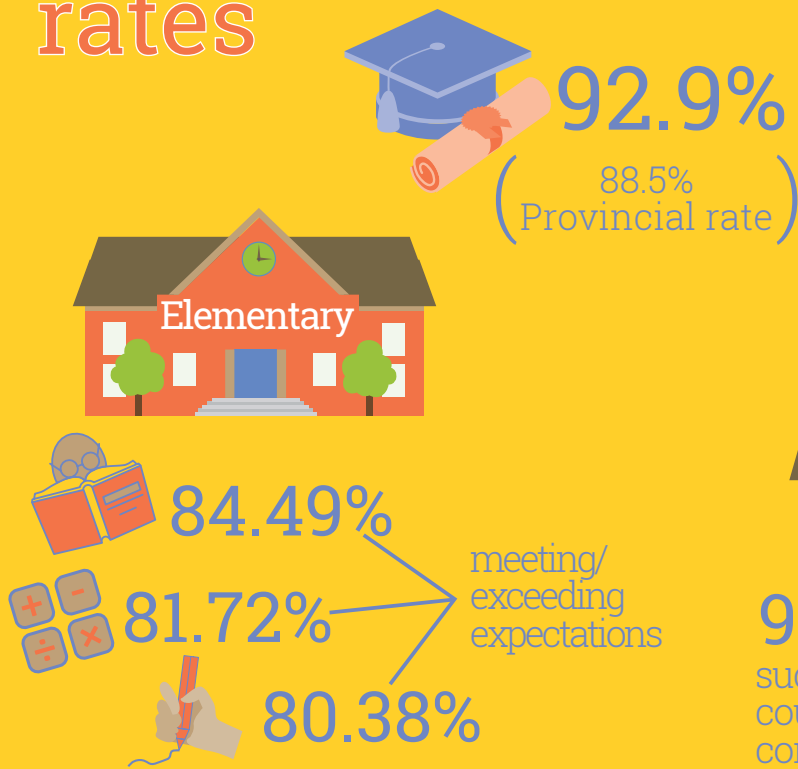
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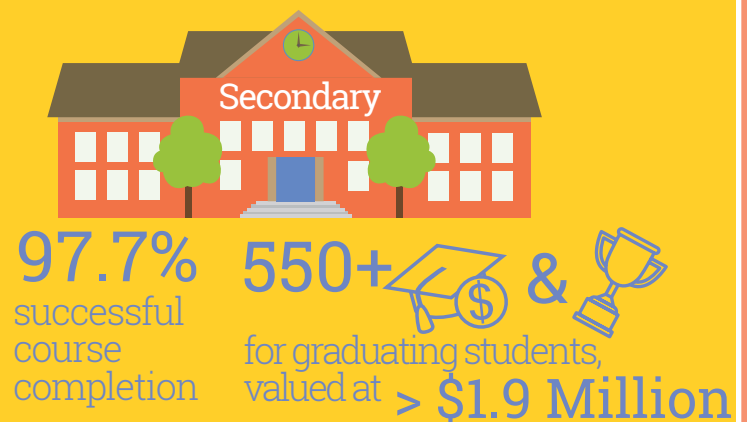
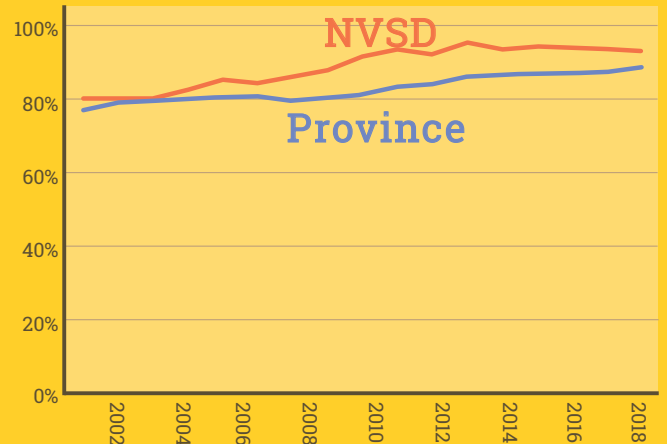

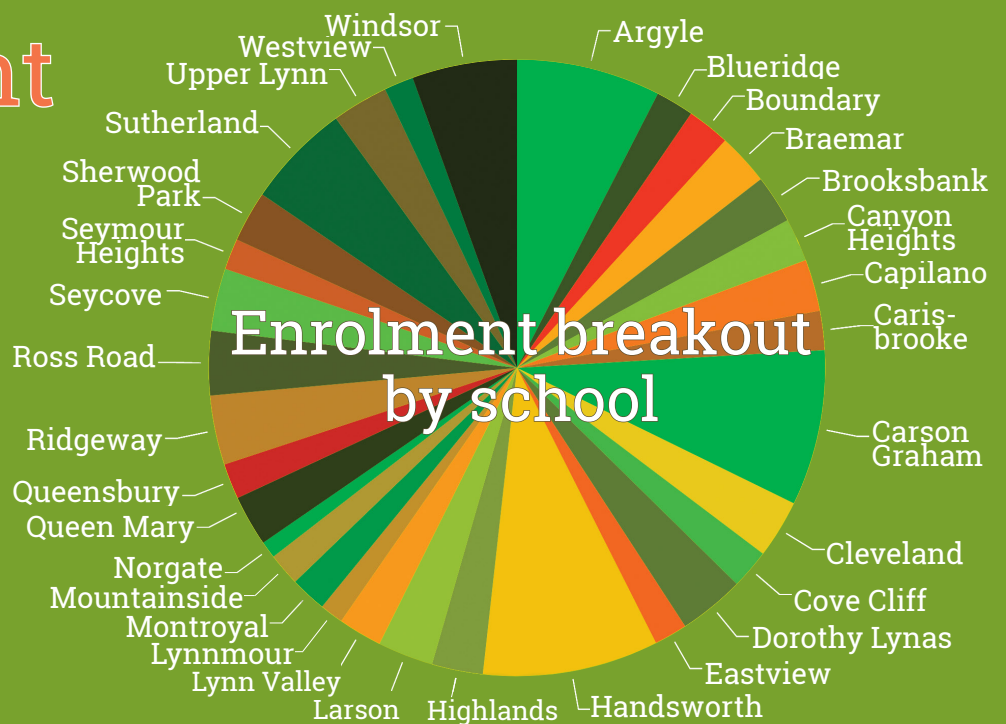


Enrolment rates

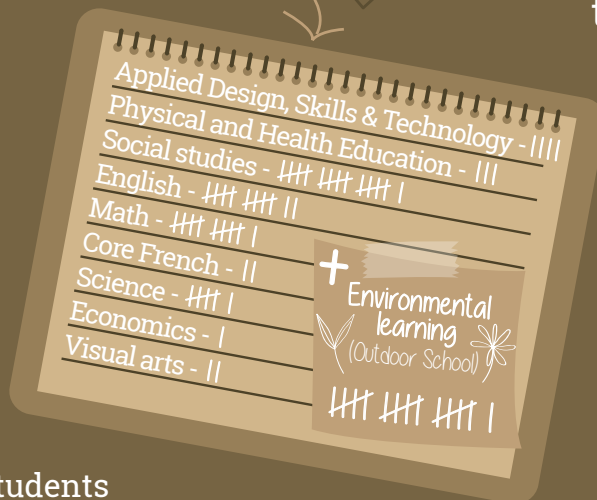

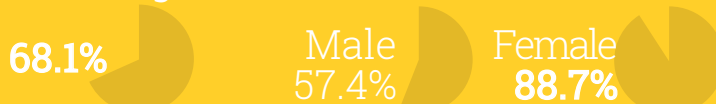

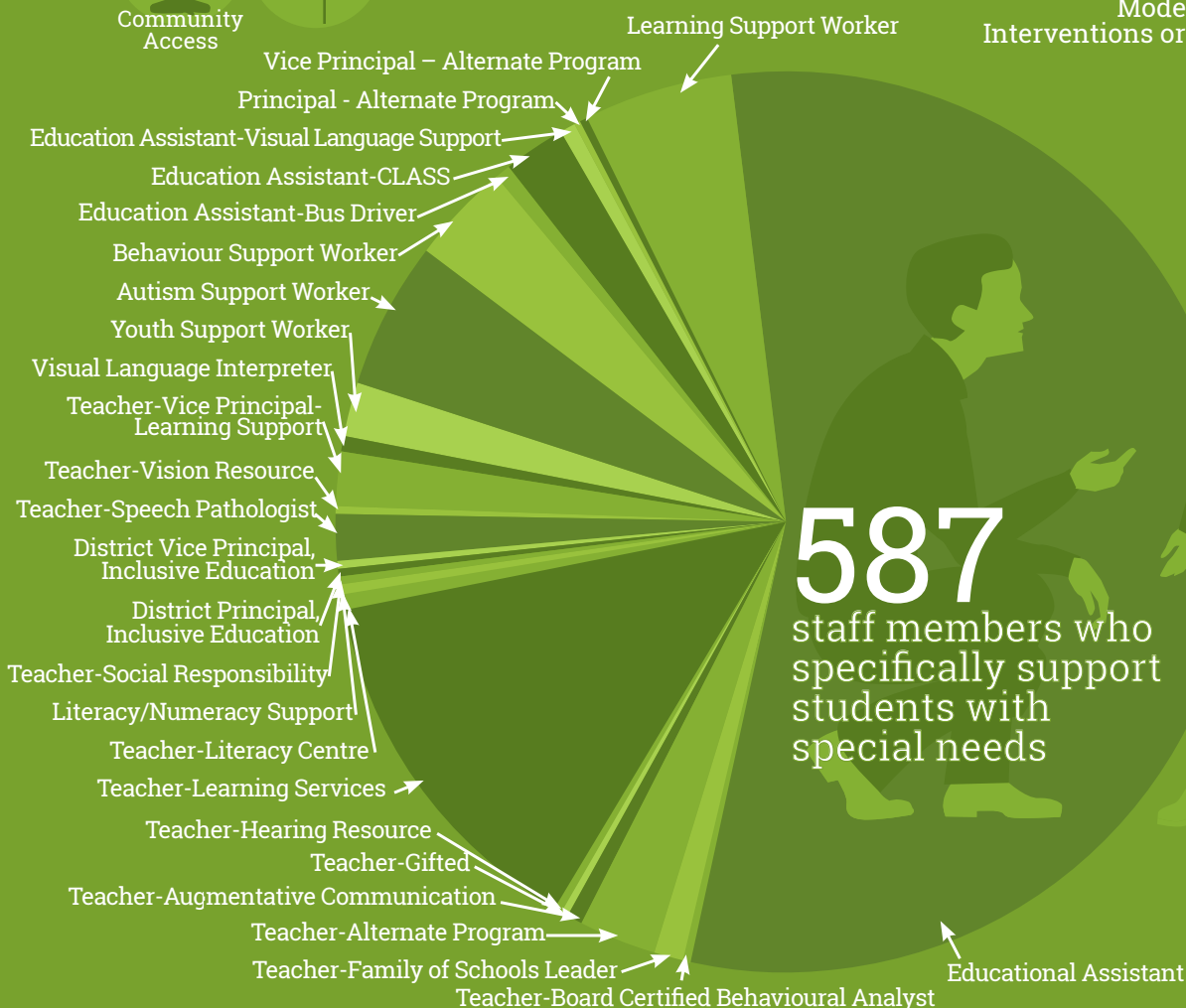
