Staying Safe in the Darker, Wetter Weather

The North Vancouver School District encourages students to get to and from school in active and safe ways. With shorter days and wet weather ahead, we ask that you take the time to review safety tips with your children:

- Be visible by wearing safety reflectors or reflective or bright clothing.
- Walk or roll to and from school with a sibling or a buddy.
- Cross streets at designated crosswalks.
- Be aware of your surroundings.
- Do not speak to strangers.
- Report anything of concern.

Severe Weather Information

As winter weather approaches, we would like to remind parents and guardians, students and staff about our winter weather procedures and announcements. SMS Text Messaging via SchoolMessenger

Parents/guardians who would like to receive SMS text messages when there is an emergency during school or non-school hours (e.g. severe weather or power outage) need to opt in for this service.

Typically, parents/guardians receive a [SchoolMessenger](#) text message on their mobile phone when their child first registers to school and registration is complete (similar to this): *"North Vancouver School District 44 messages. Reply Y to confirm, HELP 4 info. Msg & data rates may apply. Msg freq varies. schoolmessenger.com/smsca"*



Parents/guardians can also opt in to receive SMS text messages anytime by texting "Y" or "Yes" to 978338. Note: Standard message and data rates may apply.

North Shore Connects – Burrard Inlet Rapid Transit

The goal of [North Shore Connects](#), a partnership between the District of West Vancouver, Skwxwú7mesh Nation, Tsleil-Waututh Nation, City of North Vancouver and District of North Vancouver, is to prioritize transportation improvements on, to and from the North Shore and in particular, make the case for rapid transit across Burrard Inlet.
