## **Information**

### **Rapid Antigen Tests for K-12 Students**

Rapid Antigen Tests for K-12 students are beginning to arrive at NVSD schools. The Province has procured enough supply to provide one box of five test kits for each student (elementary and secondary). Families should hear directly from their child's school when the test kits will be distributed. Information on when and how to use the tests is provided in an <u>information sheet</u> prepared by the Ministry of Education.



# Restart of Routine Childhood Immunization Clinics (children 5 years and older)

Vancouver Coastal Health (VCH) has shared with the school district that it will restart routine immunization clinics in schools (these clinics had been suspended since March 2020). As part of these routine immunization clinics, the COVID-19 vaccine will be offered in elementary schools for students in Kindergarten and Grades 1, 6 and 7.

The majority of students aged 5-11 years in the VCH region have already been immunized against COVID-19. This is therefore a service for those families who have not been able to access a community immunization clinic. Note: This vaccine has already been offered routinely in secondary schools since September.

The immunization process in elementary schools, which was piloted in elementary schools in the VCH region in February, with good results, will work as follows:

- A sealed consent package will be sent to students/families via their school to offer routine immunizations available at this milestone (Kindergarten, Grades 1, 6 and 7).
- Consent packages are sealed, which ensures privacy and confidentiality are maintained (i.e. school staff will not be able to determine the immunization status of children).
- The consent package includes the opportunity for catch-up vaccines missed earlier. New this spring, the consent package will include the COVID-19 vaccine.

#### Late French Immersion - Priority Placement ends March 4

The Late French Immersion Program is a two-year intensive program designed for non-French speaking students who have successfully completed Grade 5. #### Elementary Band and Strings Program - Register by March 4

This program is open to students in Grades 5 – 7 for Band and Grades 4 – 7 for Strings. Registration for the 2022/2023 school year runs until March 4. While there is a Late Registration enrolment period, this is subject to program availability and class size at a student's school site, and is dependent on sufficient registrations received by March 4. The Young Entrepreneurship and Leadership Launchpad (YELL) provides Grade 11 and 12 students with a thorough understanding of how to apply entrepreneurial thinking to future studies, launching a business or entering the workforce. Students earn course credits toward graduation while working with teachers, business and community leaders and a mentor to design a student-led business concept.
