Student Learning Survey – Open until April 29

The Student Learning Survey (SLS), administered annually by the Ministry of Education and Child Care, is open to students in Grades 4, 7, 10 and 12, their parents/guardians, and staff and administrators in B.C. public schools. The survey covers a range of topics, providing a comprehensive picture of the educational experience in public schools and valuable insight for addressing current needs and trends.

Protect your home from the risk of wildfires

To help protect your home from the risk of wildfires during the hot, dry months of summer, District of North Vancouver Fire & Rescue Services (DNVFRS) is offering residents an in-depth fire safety home assessment through its FireSmart Home Partners program. Anyone who lives in the wildland urban interface--the area where the forest meets the community--can request this free <u>wildfire home hazard assessment</u> service. While assessing your home, wildfire mitigation specialists will point out areas where you can take steps to reduce the risks of a fire jumping from the forest to your home and surrounding vegetation.

Stop by to learn about ways to protect your property from wildfire and check out the equipment used to protect homes in one of the DNVRFS' new Structure Protection Units.
