
Our School District Community


Educating the Whole Child

English Language Learning (ELL) Services

Becoming proficient in English takes time. Students learn English better when there is meaning and purpose for communication. Receptive skills (listening/reading) develop before expressive skills (speaking/writing).



Elementary ELL Supports

- · ELL teachers in all schools
- Scheduled classes (once/week) for Beginning and Developing
- Indirect service (every 2-3 weeks) for Expanding, Consolidating and Bridging

Supports for Learning

Students will be provided with a variety of engaging learning opportunities and innovative instructional models throughout the school year. Some examples of supports are:

- English Language Learning classes and individual support
- Access to School Counsellor for academic support and personal advice
- Technology (example: all students get a Microsoft 365 account)
- Access to school Library (sometimes referred to as Learning Commons)
- Learning Assistance and Choices program as needed

How long can my child receive ELL support?

Every child progresses at different rates and some students may require less time and other more. Language learning takes many years to develop and there are many variables that impact language acquisition. Some key factors are: age of arrival, English proficiency upon arrival to Canada, extent of schooling in first language, first language proficiency, work habits, motivation, and exposure to English outside of school.



Parents/Caregivers as Educational Partners

- Strong home school partnerships and communication help children feel successful in school. Please feel free to contact the school
- Provide your child with opportunities to develop their language skills within meaningful contexts (play, learning a new skill, friendships)
- Ask your child questions about their school day and learning, and stay involved in your child's school journey
- Read with your child in your first language and use dual language texts available at local libraries. Research shows students who continue to use their home language typically develop a rich vocabulary and strong academic skills in English
- Look for opportunities in the community for your child to learn English



Back to School

- Central Registration will confirm your child's school placement as soon as possible
- Explore your child's school website, as well as the North Vancouver School District website to gain valuable information and insights ahead of the year
- School offices will open in late August
- Information about school supplies and schedules will be provided to new families in early September.
 Please obtain some general school supplies prior to the first day. More specific supply needs will be communicated by the school or teacher
- Consider taking a practice trip to and from your child's school so they become comfortable with the transportation plan
- Secondary students: please confirm courses with the school counselor
- First day of school (early September) is a partial day; the second day is a full day of classes. Please check your school's calendar for dates and times
- New students often meet in the gym, library or their homeroom on the first day. Each school will send out specific instructions
- Try and keep you child excited and positive about the new school year!
