

Frequently Asked Questions: Cloverley Elementary School

What if I would like my child(ren) to remain at their current school?

If you live within the new catchment and are receiving this letter, your child(ren) has/have been placed at Cloverley Elementary School. You may, however, apply through Central Registration to remain at your current school or to request another school under <u>Policy 605: Admission of Students to School</u>. *This application process will be open from January 2 to March 13, 2026.*

Please keep in mind that all four schools involved in last spring's catchment review (Ridgeway, Brooksbank, Queen Mary, and Queensbury) are currently operating at or above capacity. With continued enrolment growth in the area, Cloverley Elementary will play a key role in easing space pressures by welcoming in-catchment students. Because of this, applications submitted under Policy 605 are not guaranteed approval and will depend on available space.

Will there be an opportunity to visit Cloverley Elementary before the first day of school?

While a school orientation is something we aspire to offer, the site is currently an active construction zone. For safety reasons, access is limited to approved construction personnel. We will look for opportunities to visit the school dependent on the completion of construction.

I have a child with a disability or diverse ability who will be attending Cloverley Elementary. Will there be an opportunity to meet with someone to discuss their individual program and accessibility needs?

Yes. Families of students with a disability or a diverse ability will have the opportunity to meet with school staff before the summer to review Individual Education Plans (IEPs), discuss accessibility needs, and ensure appropriate transition supports are in place before the 2026-27 school year begins.

I understand that Cloverley Elementary will have childcare spaces. How do I apply?

We are pleased that North Shore Neighbourhood House will provide childcare at the Cloverley site. Cloverley Elementary will include 37 spaces dedicated to day care and 50 spaces dedicated to before- and after-school care. Is there an existing safe routes to school plan?

The City of North Vancouver will be preparing a Safe Routes to School plan for Cloverley Elementary. This plan will help ensure that walking, cycling, and driving routes are as safe as possible for students and families. As construction of the new school is finalized, the school district will work closely with the City of North Vancouver to establish and communicate these routes.

Who will be the principal of Cloverley Elementary School?

We are pleased to announce that Tim MacLeod has been appointed as the Principal of Cloverley Elementary. Currently the Principal of Upper Lynn Elementary School, Mr. MacLeod is a well-respected, experienced and compassionate educational leader who has dedicated much of his career to the North Vancouver School District. He is looking forward to welcoming all families to Cloverley.

What grades will Cloverley Elementary offer?

For the 2026-27 school year, Cloverley will offer Kindergarten through Grade 5. For the 2027-28 school year, Cloverley will offer Kindergarten through Grade 6. Beginning in the 2028-29 school year, Cloverley will offer Kindergarten through Grade 7.

What secondary school will my child transition to after they finish Grade 7 at Cloverley Elementary School? Cloverley Elementary is a feeder school to Sutherland Secondary School.
