

# Superintendent's Report



Dear Parents and Guardians,

It has been two weeks since Tk'emlúps te Secwépemc First Nation shared the devastating and tragic news that the remains of 215 Indigenous children were located in an unmarked grave at the site of the former Kamloops Indian Residential School.

These past two weeks have been difficult for all of us, but particularly for Indigenous students, educators and staff of the NVSD, Indigenous members of the North Vancouver community and Indigenous peoples throughout Canada and beyond.

As we continue to process the news, a process which is different for each of us, we are grateful to the members of the NVSD Indigenous Education team, and especially at this time, for their ongoing teachings and guidance and for inviting members of the school district family to participate in ceremony to honour the 215 children, including drum circles and healing circles.

It is heartening to see [students and staff of their school communities come together](#) and wear orange shirts to honour the children, to listen and to learn, and to take what they have learned home for further discussions with family. No matter the age, dialogue and understanding around the history of Canada's treatment of Indigenous peoples is happening, and we are encouraged by this.

As a reminder, resources are available to support conversations among students, staff and families at home. Resources have been curated by the [NVSD Indigenous Education team](#) and the [Arts Education team](#). In addition, the school district's [Social Emotional Learning and Mental Health website](#) includes resources to support children, youth and families process stressful events.

I would also like to acknowledge this week's tragic and senseless violent incident in London, Ontario, which led to the death of four members of a family of five, one child in hospital recovering, and a community and nation reeling from what police believe was a targeted attack on a Muslim family. There is no place for hate and discrimination in our



society—none—and our hearts go out to the victims, their families and friends and the wider Muslim Canadian community.

At the North Vancouver School District, we strongly believe it is through education that we can create a society made up of thoughtful, compassionate citizens who collectively work to create a healthy and inclusive society for all. I therefore encourage everyone to continue to listen, understand and learn about the stories and lived experiences of all Canadians, for the betterment of all, but especially for children and youth.

### New School Trustee

### Pride Month

At the North Vancouver School District, we believe all schools should be inclusive places where students feel safe, accepted, respected and welcome. We are committed to ensuring students see themselves reflected in their school community and feel empowered to be the best version of themselves.

Pride Month is in June and commemorates the Stonewall Riots that occurred in June 1969. The catalyst for early Pride celebrations was the need for equal rights to be extended to all LGBTQ2S+ people. This call for a world without discrimination based on sexual orientation, gender identity or gender expression is the reason we continue to celebrate Pride today.

In December 2019, the school district’s Sexual Orientation and Gender Identity (SOGI) Core Team designed a rainbow sticker to be displayed in classrooms and schools. The rainbow sticker is a symbol used to signify a commitment to providing safe and supportive spaces for students, staff, families, community members and visitors.

The rainbow colours represent the LGBTQ+ community; the pink, blue and white colours represent the transgender community; and the brown and black colours represent two-spirited, Indigenous and people of colour in the LGBTQ2S+ community.

## **VCH School Immunization Program Update**

Due to COVID-19 and the need to reallocate resources, Vancouver Coastal Health (VCH) had placed on hold its school-based immunization program. We have now been informed that VCH *may* begin to contact secondary schools to try to schedule a regular school immunization clinic (grade 9 and catch-up) before the end of the school year. In the fall, VCH will begin planning for the regular school immunization clinics (grade 6, grade 9 and catch-up) for the 2021/22 school year. More information will be shared when it is made available to the school district.

Should families wish to have their child(ren) immunized sooner than when the school clinic becomes available, they should consult with their medical health professional. Regarding COVID-19 vaccines for youth (age 12-17), VCH expects these to continue through the existing community clinics over the summer.
