School Re-opening Update

On June 1st, school districts across the province moved to Stage 3 of BC's [K to 12 Education Restart Plan](#). While I acknowledge the range of emotions families may be feeling with the movement to a gradual and partial school re-opening, I would also like to share that there has been a great deal of excitement about moving to this next stage.

Our staff and administration have reported that the school re-opening has provided a greater sense of normalcy for both staff and students. We remain heartened to see students and staff back in our buildings, and inspired by our teachers, custodians, educational assistants, office staff and Principals/Vice Principals, who continue to rise to the challenges presented over the last few months. We are thankful to all of you who have trusted us to provide for your children's education and growth in a safe and healthy environment.

The Ministry of Education has shared its hopes that the June restart will lead to a stronger school restart in September. The North Vancouver School District is now developing contingency plans around what school and educational continuity will look like in the fall, based on a number of potential scenarios. 2020/21 Preliminary Budget Status Update

Each year, the School District uses a variety of revenue generating activities to support operations and the development of a balanced Operating Budget. At the May 26, 2020, Board of Education public board meeting, the District

articulated how COVID-19 has significantly affected the development of the 2020/21 Preliminary Operating Budget.

The NVSD faces significant revenue losses, which are directly attributed to COVID-19 and of particular concern for the 2020/21 fiscal year. Due to decisions that are under the purview of the provincial and federal governments, and are in part dependent on the public feeling safe, the District is projecting declining revenue in the areas of international student enrolment, gym/classroom rental income, Cheakamus Centre rentals, and interest income. The School District must therefore plan for a budget that takes into account a significant loss of revenue.

The 2020/21 Budget will be presented at the June 23, 2020, public board meeting.

Upcoming Board of Education Meeting

To respect guidelines and orders around physical distancing and public gatherings provided by the Provincial Health Officer, public board meetings will continue to be livestreamed and recorded. Recognized partner groups and Trustees will be in physical attendance for the 2020/21 budget meeting, but members of the public will continue to be required to view the proceedings online.

Details around participation will be posted [online](#) along with the corresponding board package the Friday before the next public board meeting, which is scheduled for Tuesday, June 23, 2020, at 6:30 p.m. Please note: this will be the last public board meeting for the 2019/20 school year.
