Dear North Vancouver School District Community,

Public schooling holds a central place in the shaping of the values and morals of future society. School communities model how our broader community functions. I believe educators have the responsibility to collectively and incrementally transform society, and I find it fitting that with all that is happening around us, locally and globally, October marks both World Teachers' Day (October 5) and National Principals' Month. With that, I hope you enjoy this month's Superintendent's Report. It is meant to inform, promote and celebrate the work of the school district. I am excited for what lies ahead. I hope you are too.

Severe weather information

As winter weather approaches, we would like to issue a reminder about our winter weather procedures. All NVSD schools will remain OPEN during winter weather, including snowfalls, if possible. Any school district-wide closure will be decided by 6:30 a.m. (at the latest) and announced through media and school district and school websites, shared with parents/guardians via [SchoolMessenger](#) (email and/or text message), and shared with staff via email. SMS text messaging via SchoolMessenger

Parents/guardians who would like to receive SMS text messages when there is an emergency during school or non-school hours (e.g., severe weather or power outage) need to opt in for this service.

Typically, parents/guardians receive a [SchoolMessenger](#) text message on their mobile phone when their child first registers to school and registration is complete (similar to this message): *"North Vancouver School District 44 messages. Reply Y to confirm, HELP 4 info. Msg & data rates may apply. Msg freq varies. schoolmessenger.com/smsca"*

Parents/guardians can also opt in to receive SMS text messages anytime by texting "Y" or "Yes" to 978338. Note: Standard message and data rates may apply.

Staying safe in the darker, wetter weather

The school district encourages students to get to and from school in safe and active ways. With shorter days and wet weather ahead, we ask that you take the time to review these safety tips with your children:

- Be seen by wearing reflective materials or bright clothes and using lights after dark and in poor weather.
- Cross streets only at intersections or marked crosswalks.
- Make eye contact with drivers, ensure drivers have stopped their vehicle before crossing, and keep looking for approaching vehicles while crossing.
- Walk or roll to and from school with a sibling or a buddy.
- Be aware of your surroundings, do not speak to strangers, and report anything of concern.

Outdoor safety – Be prepared

With the cooler fall weather and shorter days, North Shore Rescue and BC AdventureSmart are reminding outdoor enthusiasts to prepare accordingly, no matter the outdoor activity:

- Make a plan and leave a copy of the plan with someone you trust. Include when they should expect you back.
- Know before you go. Know the terrain and understand the conditions and weather patterns.
- Bring navigation tools (e.g., map and compass, cell phone with a GPS mapping app and offline maps, or a handheld GPS), a whistle, a basic first-aid kit, and a headlamp (your phone's light does not count).
- Wear or carry suitable clothing (e.g., puffy jacket, rain shell, toque, gloves) and dress in layers. Wear proper footwear (e.g., hiking boots and traction such as microspikes).
- Be aware of cellular and satellite coverage in the area, as it may be limited to highway corridors or impacted by physical obstacles which can block the signal.
- Know your limits to avoid injury, getting lost/disoriented, and exceeding your abilities.
- If you need help, call 911 ASAP – there is no charge for rescue.
