Heading to the Capilano River this summer?

The Capilano River is downstream from the Cleveland Dam, which holds one of three drinking water reservoirs for the region. The volume of water and how it navigates the steep, winding curves of the river can make it unsafe. With little notice, the river can rise more than 5 metres at various points and move faster than 21 km/hour.

For your safety, stay on the designated trails in the park and around the river and also be aware of your surroundings. Under normal conditions, the trails are a safe distance from the river's edge. For more river safety tips, visit Metro Vancouver's website for more [river safety tips](#).
