Bell Schedule for 2025-26

The updated bell schedule for 2025-26 school year has been posted <u>here</u>. There are no changes to the daily schedule (class times) from this year.

Homeroom Model 2025-26

Included in the daily schedule is an adjusted schedule for homerooms. Next year, we will be piloting a homeroom model during flex time on alternating Fridays. Homerooms will be mandatory for all students and will replace flex time on designated homeroom days. This will be a time when teachers will focus on universal lessons for students focused on our school goals, including: mental health literacy, equity, diversity, inclusion, and executive functioning. The adjusted schedule on homeroom days will be:

8:30am	Period 3 or 6
9:40am	Flex time
9:49am	Homeroom
10:20am	Period 1 or 7 and return to normal schedule



X-Block Courses for 2025-26

This school year, we introduced x-block classes as a way to help with space constraints. While Argyle continues to grow, we are working carefully on our organization for next year and will be running minimal X-block classes.

The following X-block classes are scheduled to run in 2025-26:

- Jr and Sr. Jazz Band
- Vocal Jazz 8-12
- Strings 8-12
- Drama Theatre and Company 8-12

Students who selected X-block classes during course registration have been enrolled in their alternate course selections, or the equivalent in-timetable course.

Calendar 2025-26

The calendar of key school dates for 2025-26 is published <u>here</u>. The up-to-date daily calendar showing school events will be available to students and families in September as part of the agenda and online.

Course Changes and Drops for 2025-26

As part of our efforts to maximize classroom space in the school, our ability to accommodate course drops and course changes in the Fall will be limited. Except in very exceptional situations, students will be expected to take a minimum course load, outlined below. This has been communicated to students throughout the course selection process.

Grade 8	Minimum 8 courses
Grade 9	Minimum 8 courses
Grade 10	Minimum 8 courses
Grade 11	Minimum 7 courses + CLC 12 A (two credits – blended online model)
Grade 12	Minimum 6 courses + CLC 12 (four credits – blended online model)



Careers Curriculum Changes in 2025-26

In 2025-26 we will be introducing a new Career Education organization. This redesign has been done to better utilise Careers courses through grades 8-12 to prepare students for their transition out of grade 12. This reorganization has previously been shared with parents and students through the course selection process.

Grade 12	<u>Career Life Connections 12B</u> – 2 credit Graduation requirement **starting 2026-27
	Two credit course offered in blended online model through Teams with mandatory
	biweekly attendance in flex time
	Note – grade 12 students in 2025-26 will complete the complete Career Life
	Education 12 4-credit course in a blended online model

The table above shows the Career Life Connections 12 course split into two two-credit courses over grade 11 and 12, rather than our current model of one 4-credit course offered in grade 12.

- Career Life Connections A (grade 11) will focus on post-secondary research, course planning, and preparation for applications to post-secondary.
- Career Life Connections B (Grade 12) will be rolled out in 2026-27 and will focus on postsecondary transition and a capstone project all students must complete.

Argyle Breakfast Program

The school district is able to offer the breakfast program through targeted funding provided by the provincial government to assure food access for students. Every morning, students have access to bagels with toppings and fresh fruit in room 182.

Multiple families have reached out to ask how they can contribute to the food access program. They have voiced their appreciation for the program as their student benefits from the program.

The program can expand with donations from the community.

- A donation receipt will be emailed to you upon completion of your cart checkout

Donations will be used to expand breakfast offerings, and will be designated for the program, not used for other programs or services offered by the school district.


Tennis
