Principal's Update


Dear Argyle families,

Photo Consent & Yearbook

School Updates & Upcoming Events

Course Programming 2026-27

In February, students will need to select their courses for the 2026-2027 school year. Please work with your students to make wise choices now. We use the choices students make in February to staff the school and build the whole timetable. Grade counsellors will share key information about course selection, graduation requirements and elective choices.

For current grade 8 students:

- February 5th 8:30am – Mandatory assembly for all grade 8 students. Arrive before 8:30am for 8:30am start. Attendance is mandatory.
- February 6th – Homeroom – students will have a chance to ask questions and explore the Argyle website to learn about course programming information.

For current grade 9-11 students:

- February 6th – Course programming presentations in homeroom classes. Attendance is mandatory.

Always staff supported and open to all students, students can drop by room 195 any day at lunch to check it out.



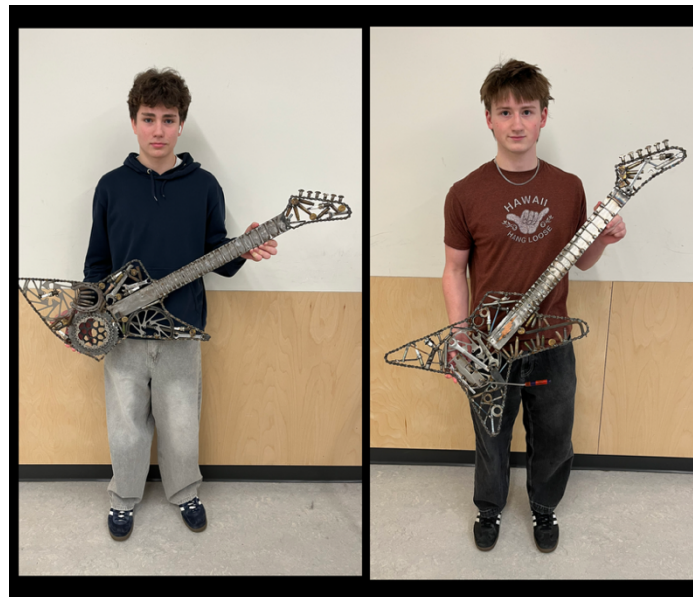


JABC

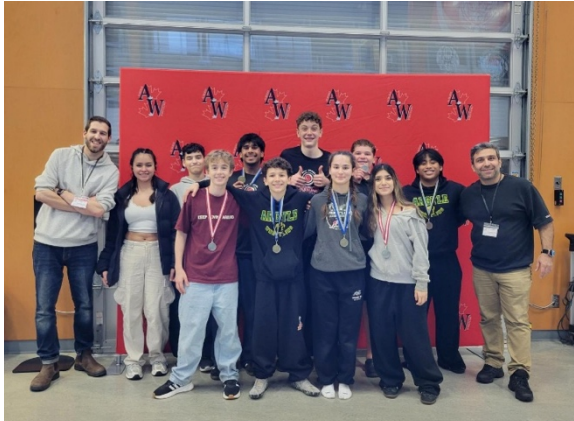
Athletics Updates
