Overview: Welcome to English 10: New Media and Composition. The objective of this course is to investigate, inquire, discuss and interpret the following big ideas:

- Language shapes ideas and influences others.
- Texts are socially, culturally, geographically, and historically constructed.

- People understand text differently depending on their world views and perspectives.
- Digital citizens have rights and responsibilities in an increasingly globalized society
- Engagement with writing processes can support creativity and enhance clarity of expression.

We will often be discussing complex and sometimes controversial issues. I expect you to behave in a mature manner appropriate for our class. I am here to guide, motivate, and teach you, but you are responsible for your own learning. Take the initiative, ask for help when you need it, and engage in the course.

Course Materials: Please bring each of the following to every class. Note that sharing of materials between students is not permitted.

- (1.) **3- ring binder with paper or notebook**
- (2.) Pen/pencil, highlighter
- (3.) A personal planner or agenda
- (4.) A personal book for silent reading

Main Class Rules:

- (1.) Treat others **respectfully** do not threaten, make fun of, or make personal attacks on others.
- (2.) When someone in the class is speaking in a discussion, everyone else must be **listening**.

- (3.) All major assignments must be completed satisfactorily to pass the course.
- (4.) If you are not in your seat ready to go when the bell rings, you are late.
- (5.) Try your best. Do not hand in other people's work. Do not copy other students' work or plagiarize.
- (6.) If you *need* to leave the class raise your hand and ask me before leaving.
- (7.) Keep your cell phone in your bag. Do not use it during class time UNLESS you have checked with me about using it for some educational purpose.
- (8.) Food and drink is limited to simple snacks (i.e. a granola bar) and other beverages.
- (9.) Keep the class clean. Leave the classroom the same way it was when you arrived.
- (10.) At the end of the period, wait in your seat to be dismissed.

Content: During this course you will look at various types of media, the interaction of media and social issues, and topics of digital citizenship. Composition is included within the course. Our units of study are:

- Graphic Novels and Social Inquiry
- Digital Citizenship (including Course Final Project)
