Assessment and Evaluation
The work of students will be evaluated in a variety of ways:
$\square$ Formative assessment will be used to monitor student learning in order to modify teaching and learning strategies with the goal of improving student mastery.
$\square$ Summative assessment will be used to evaluate skill acquisition, student learning and mastery of specific content areas in order to summarize student development at a particular time.
$\square$ Performance based assessment uses a set of criteria that require students to demonstrate their knowledge and skills, including the manner in which they solve problems. Performance based assessment will be used to measure how well students can apply what they know, often to real-world situations such as conversations in French.
