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General Learning Outcomes

It is expected that students will:

- develop language-learning strategies
- perseverance with challenging tasks
- understand one's role as a learner

Curriculum Competencies

This is a beginning French course based on the five language skills: speaking, listening, reading, writing and interacting. This course will be taught using a method called **TPR Storytelling** (Teaching Proficiency through Reading and Storytelling). **TPRS** lessons use a mixture of interacting, storytelling and reading to give students strategies to learn a foreign language in a classroom setting. It is a highly effective method of teaching foreign languages that produces rewarding results. An emphasis is placed on the application process rather on the memorization of grammar rules. To enhance the learning students will be expected to:

- respond in French during the language instruction
- understand and retell stories
- participate in reciprocal interactions
- explore similarities and differences between French and English languages
- demonstrate learned structures and vocabulary via various written and oral narrations
- become knowledgeable of the Francophone culture

Assessment & Evaluation Breakdown

Students are evaluated on their speaking ability, listening comprehension, reading and interacting competency, and writing proficiency.
