Spanish 10 Course outline

Course objective

The objective of this course is to help you <u>acquire</u> a higher level of listening, speaking, reading and writing of the Spanish language and to introduce you to some aspects of Spanish cultures. You will be <u>acquiring</u> Spanish by hearing it spoken and using it in <u>contexts that you understand</u>.

Course Content

We will be using various stories as the basis for the course. We will also be reading 1-2 novels over the course of the semester. The class will be taught using conversation, stories, reading, acting, movie clips and music via the TPRS method (Teaching Proficiency through Reading and Storytelling).

BIG IDEAS:

Listening and viewing with intent supports our acquisition and understanding on a new language.

Stories give us unique ways to understand and reflect on meaning.

Expressing ourselves and engaging in conversation in a new language require courage, risk taking, and perserverence.

Cultural expression can take many different forms.

Acquiring a new language provides a unique opportunity to access and interact with diverse communities.

CLASS PARTICIPATION:

It is imperative for you to participate and engage with the class dynamic in order to achieve the understanding and use of the language. Speaking is a crucial part to practicing a language and you will be expected to do so.

• Regular attendance is mandatory to be successful in this course. All learning is based upon the stories that are told in class; there is no textbook for this course. Simply put, if you miss class, you will miss the stories, and it will be very difficult to catch up.

• Students must look like they are **participating**: you need to act engaged, contribute to stories and discussions, **listen** to me and your classmates, **ask questions** when you do not understand, take notes when appropriate, and **speak** as much Spanish as you can.

ASSESSMENT & EVALUATION:

Your daily homework consists of reviewing all new vocabulary and reviewing each story we cover. You will also have one digital comic strip retell or a speed write and one dramatization per story. Students will be assessed in a variety of ways for this course. All quizzes & timed writing will be based on the stories told in class. Please note that these assessments are unannounced and that in order to be successful, you must attend class and review regularly. Students are encouraged to seek extra help, which is available during flex time:
