### **Course objective**

The objective of this course is to help you <u>acquire</u> a higher level of listening, speaking, reading and writing of the Spanish language and to introduce you to some aspects of Spanish cultures. You will be <u>acquiring</u> Spanish by hearing it spoken and using it in <u>contexts that you understand</u>.

#### **Course Content**

We will be using various stories as the basis for the course. We will also be reading one or two novels over the course of the year. The class will be taught using conversation, stories, reading, movie clips and music via the **TPRS** (Teaching Proficiency through **R**eading and **S**torytelling) method.

# **BIG IDEAS:**

Language learning is a lifelong process.

With increased language proficiency, we can discuss and justify opinions with nuance and clarity.

Becoming more proficient in a new language enables us to explore global issues.

Sharing our feelings, opinions, and beliefs in a new language contributes to our identity.

Exploring diverse forms of cultural expression promotes greater understanding and appreciation of cultures worldwide.

# CLASS PARTICIPATION:

It is imperative for you to participate and engage with the class dynamic in order to achieve the understanding and use of the language.

# ASSESSMENT & EVALUATION:

Your daily homework consists of reviewing all new vocabulary and reviewing each story we cover. You will also have one dramatization per story. Students will be assessed in a variety of ways for this course. All quizzes & timed writing will be based on the stories told in class. Please note that these assessments are unannounced and that in order to be successful, you must **attend class** and **review regularly**. Students are encouraged to seek extra help, which is available every Day 1 at lunch in room 206.
