

Post-Secondary Options

In Canada there are several types of post-secondary Schools:

- Institutes
- Colleges
- Universities (both large and small)

A recognized post-secondary school can grant:

- certificates
- diplomas
- degrees
- other qualifications

Universities

There are eleven public universities in British Columbia and 97 across Canada.

Entrance requirements for Most BC Universities:

GPA - based on English 12 plus 3-4 approved grade 12 courses **OR** an average of program-specific grade 11 & 12 courses.

- > check "recommended" not minimum
- check specific course pre-requisites for postsecondary courses

Out of Province Universities

English 12 plus 4 other approved Grade 12 courses (varies by program of study)



Institutes and Colleges

Colleges and institutes usually offer shorter programs than universities (1 to 3 years). Many college programs result in earning a diploma or certificate that will qualify graduates to do specific jobs in different industries such as Trades, IT, Healthcare and Business among others.

Some institutes and colleges are also beginning to offer full degree programs and/or University Transfer programs.


Some programs require portfolios and/or interviews and some are first come first served. Apply early (waitlists)



Post-Secondary Requirements?

Depends on school & program **Check websites**

Options for post-secondary schools and programs are almost endless. Students need to begin to narrow their interests, yet be aware that they might change their minds about their post-secondary paths.



Post-Secondary (cont.)

Students may be asked to <u>self-report</u> Grade 11 final marks and mid-year grade12 marks

Students must complete PSI selections on BCeID - Student Transcript Service. Official grades are sent to post-secondary schools automatically in <u>March</u> and again in <u>July</u>

Broad based applications – <u>Holistic Approach</u> to undergraduate applicants (some specific programs and post-secondary institutions)

Personal Profiles can be very important:

- extra-curricular activities
- community involvement
- volunteer work
- leadership

5. Recognition of breadth, rigour, and relevancy in your coursework

This comprehensive approach to UBC admission focuses primarily on marks in academic courses, but also considers breadth, rigour, and relevancy of coursework are not required for admission to UBC, but will be recognized in the academic admissions evaluation.

Ask yourself the following questions:

- Have you excelled in your secondary school studies and received good grades?
- Have you pursued all your academic interests in secondary school? This would demonstrate breadth.
- Have you challenged yourself by taking additional academic courses, advanced courses, or first-year-university courses? This
 would demonstrate rigour.
- Have you demonstrated knowledge in your area of study by taking courses in secondary school related to the degree you intend
 to apply at UBC? This would demonstrate relevancy.

If it isn't possible for you to demonstrate breadth, rigour, or relevancy due to personal circumstance (e.g., your school does not offer a wide selection of courses; family or financial commitments limit your ability to take these courses), you should identify these circumstances in your application to UBC. UBC will consider these circumstances on a case-by-case basis.

Adult Basic Education


- Complete university prerequisites
- Improve their marks in Grade 11 or 12 courses (Math, Biology, Physics, Chemistry, English, History and Computers) needed as prerequisites for post-secondary studies
- Complete their high school courses and achieve their BC Adult Dogwood Graduation Diploma

Two Routes to Your Educational Goal:

- •The Direct Route enter a post-secondary institution directly from high school.
- •The Transfer Route start at one institution, then transfer. This route can be taken whether or not you are eligible for the direct route.

Admission: English Language Standards

Students have a minimum of 3-5 years of English language instruction in Canada

OR

- Students have a satisfactory score on the TOEFL, IELTS, CAEL language proficiency tests if English isn't their first language
- Students who do not meet a minimum grade in English Language Arts 12 may need to write an assessment such as: TOEFL, IELTS, CAEL or an institution specific exam (please check the website of institution of choice)

Cost of Post-Secondary

** Costs vary by program and institute **

- Full-time studies cost an <u>average</u> of \$8000 a year
- Textbooks, living expenses and transportation are additional costs to consider
- International student costs will be 2-3 times more
- Attending college first and earning University Transfer Credits is one way to save on tuition and transition to a degree program at university as tuition costs at colleges are significantly lower

Earning Scholarships & Bursaries

Scholarships are not based solely on academic performance Bursaries are based on demonstrated financial need
