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2. Post-Secondary Options in Canada

- **Institutes, Colleges, and Universities:** Options include skill-based and trades schools, certificates, diplomas, degrees, and transfer programs.
- **Application Tips:**
 - Check GPA and course prerequisites for programs.
 - Many institutions require self-reported Grade 11 and Grade 12 marks.
 - Personal profiles (e.g., volunteer work, leadership) may play a role.
 - Early admissions are Oct 1-Dec 1 (Grade 11 marks) for top 2% of student applicants and roll over to regular admissions in the Spring.
