ELIGIBILITY

- Minimum of 15 hours per week of specific training in ONE discipline year-round at regional, provincial, or national level in sport or performing art.
- The student must be in good academic standing.
- Recommendation of coach or person responsible for training program indicating supervised training a minimum of 15 hours per week, and proof that this training conflicts with our school schedule.
- The letter must also detail the specific training and activities undertaken by the applicant – **must reapply annually**

SUMMER LEARNING?

WHY TAKE A SUMMER COURSE?

- Create room for extra electives
- Reduce academic pressure
- Catch up, or get ahead

GUIDELINES:

1. Choose your courses for the Fall based on the assumption that you have completed summer classes successfully.
2. Be aware that there is **no guarantee** of a spot in a senior class if you advance through summer. You will be placed on a waitlist and seniors will have priority if there is a lack of space.
3. You will still be held to the course minimum guidelines as the rest of your grade group.
4. Have your parent/guardian email me informing me they intend to have you do an **ACADEMIC summer class** and indicate which course that will be.
 - a. Example: Tracy will be taking Physics 11 in the summer and is requesting Physics 12 for September.

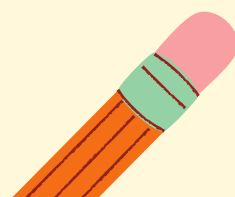
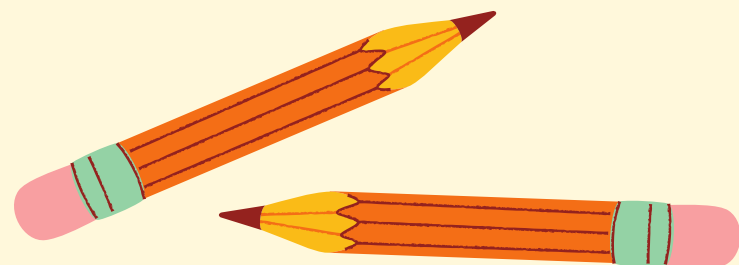

You will be able to see a list of your course requests on MyEd after **February 27th** and a verification sheet will be sent to your guardians in the Spring for confirmation






